### SETTING THE SCENE

- No. 7 Indiana (6-1, 6-1 B1G East) faces Ole Miss (4-5, 4-5 SEC West) in the 35th Outback Bowl on Saturday, Jan. 2. Kickoff is set for 12:30 p.m. EST at Raymond James Stadium (Tifway 419 Bermuda Grass) on ABC.
- IU is playing in consecutive January bowls for the first time in school history.
- The Hoosiers are in their first Outback Bowl and their second bowl in the state of Florida (2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl).
- Indiana is making its 13th bowl appearance and its fourth in the last six seasons. (more on page 59)
- IU is ranked for a program record ninth-consecutive week, coming in at No. 7 in the Associated Press Top 25 and at No. 8 in the Amway Coaches Poll presented by USA Today Sports.
- The Hoosiers have been ranked in the Top 10 six times in 2020, the second-most in school history (9 weeks in 1945).
- Indiana collected its first Top-10 ranking in the Nov. 8 AP Poll (No. 10) since Sept. 22, 1969 (No. 10).
- IU's No. 7 rating is its best in the AP Poll since Nov. 27, 1967 (No. 4).
- The Hoosiers three Top-25 victories are tied for the second-most in the country behind Alabama's four.
- Their three Top-25 wins also matched the 1945 team's program record.
- Indiana's 6-1 record is its best start since 1993 (7-1).
- IU is 14-6 overall and 11-5 in league play since the beginning of the 2019 campaign. Its 14 victories share fourth and its 11 Big Ten wins share third among all B1G teams during that span.
- With their victory over Maryland, the Hoosiers clinched a winning league record in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1987-88 and for the sixth time overall (1967-68, 1944-46 and 1936-37).
- Indiana's six conference wins are tied for the most in school history (1967, 1987).
- IU's 11 Big Ten victories are tied for the most in program history over a two-year span (1987-88).
- The Hoosiers collected their first win over No. 16 Wisconsin (14-6) since defeating the Badgers in back-to-back seasons on Oct. 6, 2001 (63-32) and on Oct. 12, 2002 (32-29), the former coming at Camp Randall Stadium.
- Indiana recorded its first road victory over a ranked opponent since No. 18 Missouri on Sept. 20, 2014 (31-27), and its first B1G road win over a ranked opponent since No. 22 Michigan State on Nov. 10, 2001 (37-28).
- Wisconsin's six points marked its lowest total against IU since Oct. 24, 1992 (3), and it was U-W's first game without a touchdown since Oct. 3, 2015, against Iowa.
- The Hoosiers matched a school record with five-straight league victories (1967) before losing at No. 3 Ohio State and have won 11 of their last 14, their most successful stretch in conference games in program history.
- Indiana defeated Michigan State, 24-0, to reclaim the Old Brass Spitoon for the first time since 2016 and earn its first win in East Lansing since 2001.
- IU's 38-21 victory over No. 23 Michigan was its first over the Wolverines since Oct. 24, 1987 (14-10).
- The Hoosiers 36-35, overtime win against No. 8 Penn State in the season opener was the sixth against a Top-10 opponent in school history, with the last coming at No. 9 Ohio State (31-10) on Oct. 10, 1987.
- It marked Indiana's first Top-10 victory at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 25, 1967 (No. 3 Purdue, 19-14).
- IU has defeated PSU, U-M, MSU and UW in the same season for the first time in program history and beaten the Wolverines and Spartans in the same year for the first time since 1967.
- Senior WR **Ty Fryfogle** and junior LB **Micah McFadden** earned third-team Associated Press All-America honors.

**TEAM**

**THE GAME**

- Indiana and Ole Miss will meet for the first time on Saturday.
- This marks IU's fifth bowl game against an SEC opponent: 1988 Peach Bowl (27-22 loss to Tennessee on Jan. 2), 1988 Liberty Bowl (34-10 win over South Carolina on Dec. 28), 1990 Peach Bowl (27-23 loss to Auburn on Dec. 30), 2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl (23-22 loss to Tennessee on Jan. 2).
- The Hoosiers hold a 27-22-1 (.550) all-time record against SEC opponents.
- Indiana is looking for its first bowl victory since a 24-0 whitewashing of Baylor in the 1991 Copper Bowl on Dec. 31.
- IU is playing its first non-conference game of the year.
- The Hoosiers have won nine of their last 10 out-of-conference contests.

**TAMPA CONNECTION**

- Twenty-two Hoosiers arrived in Bloomington from the state of Florida, including 10 from the Tampa area: **Thomas Allen** (Tampa/Plant H.S.), **D.K. Bonhomme** (Clearwater/Academy International), **Juwan Burgess** (Tampa/Plant), **Jonathan King** (Tampa/Tech), **Micah McFadden** (Tampa/Plant), **James Miller** (Tampa/Armwood), **Sio Nofogagototo'a** (Clearwater/Academy International), **Michael Penix Jr.** (Tampa/Tech) and **Whop Philyor** (Tampa/Plant).
- **Tom Allen** began his coaching career as the head coach at Temple Heights High School in Tampa from 1992-94.
- He served as defensive coordinator at Armwood High School in 1995 and 1996.
- Allen returned to Tampa in 2015 as the defensive coordinator at the University of South Florida before he made his way to Indiana in 2016.

**OLE MISS TIES**

- **Tom Allen** worked at Ole Miss as linebackers coach/special teams coordinator from 2012-14.
- Allen was on the same staff as Chris Kiffin, Lane's brother, who was Mississippi's defensive line coach from 2012-16.
- Defensive coordinator **Kane Wommack**, one of five finalists for the 2020 Broyles Award, served as a graduate assistant in Oxford from 2012-13.
- His father, Dave, was the Rebels defensive coordinator from 2012-16.
- Co-offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach **Grant Heard** was a wide receiver at Ole Miss (1996-2000) and later was a member of the staff as wide receivers coach from 2012-16.
- His wife, Renata, was a four-year letterwinner on the Mississippi volleyball team (1997-2000).
- His brother, Ronnie, was a safety with the Rebels (1995-99).
- Safeties coach **Jason Jones** spent six years (2013-18) as co-defensive coordinator at Ole Miss.
- He coached cornerbacks at Florida Atlantic University in 2019 on Lane Kiffin's staff.
- Four Hoosier players hail from the state of Mississippi: OL **Kahlil Benson** (Southaven), WR **Ty Fryfogle** (Lucedale), DT **Jerome Johnson** (Bassfield) and DB **Christopher Keys** (Collins).

**TOM ALLEN**

- **Tom Allen** is one of nine finalists for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award. He became Indiana's first finalist for the award since **John Pont** won it in 1967.
- Allen is one of eight finalists for the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award.
- He is one of five finalists for the Dodd Trophy.
- For the second time in as many years, Allen is a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award
- He was named the Big Ten's Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year (coaches vote) and Dave McClain Coach of the Year (media vote). Allen joined **Bill Mallory** (1986 and 1987) as the only IU head coaches to earn B1G Coach of the Year honors.
- The American Football Coaches Association selected Allen as the Region 3 Coach of the Year. He joined Mallory (1986 and 1987) as the only Hoosier head coaches to earn Region 3 Coach of the Year accolades.

**ALL-BIG TEN**

- A school record 16 Hoosiers earned All-Big Ten honors.
- **Tom Allen** was named the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year (coaches) and Dave McClain Coach of the Year (media).
- Senior **Ty Fryfogle** became the first wideout in Indiana history to be named the Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year.
- A program record seven Hoosiers, including a school record four first-teamers, collected defensive accolades.
- Fifth-year senior **Jerome Johnson** is the first IU DT to earn first-team honors since Hurvin McCormack (1993).
- Junior **Jamar Johnson** is the first Hoosier first-teamer at S since Eric Allen (1996).
- Sophomore **Tiawan Mullen** is Indiana's first first-team selection at CB since Tracy Porter (2007).
- Junior LB **Micah McFadden** rounds out the first-team quartet.
- Junior CB **Jaylin Williams** notched second-team recognition (coaches, media), while junior S **Devon Matthews** secured third-team laurels (coaches, media).
- Junior LB **Cam Jones** was recognized by the coaches and media as honorable mention.
- Fryfogle also earned first-team all-conference honors from the league's media.
- Junior RB **Stevie Scott III** and redshirt sophomore QB **Michael Penix Jr.** received second-team accolades (coaches, media), while redshirt TE **Peyton Hendershot** picked up third-team laurels (coaches, media).
- Senior C **Harry Crider** and senior WR **Whop Philyor** were honorable-mention All-B1G (coaches, media).
- Redshirt sophomore K **Charles Campbell** picked up second-team All-Big Ten honors (coaches, media).
- P **Haydon Whitehead** and RS **Reese Taylor** carded honorable-mention recognition from the coaches and media.
- Fifth-year senior DE **Michael Ziemba** was named the team's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree.

**TEAM**

- Indiana leads the Big Ten (T-4th nationally) in takeaway margin (+10), interceptions (17, 1st) and takeaways (20, T-10th).
- The Ohio State game (Nov. 21) marked IU's first regular-season Top-10 showdown in program history and just the second overall (1968 Rose Bowl, No. 4 Indiana vs. No. 1 Southern Cal).
- Prior to their loss at No. 3 OSU, the Hoosiers won three-straight Big Ten road games for the first time since 1982 and earned victories in their first two league games away from home for the first time since 1993.
- Indiana opened 4-0 for the first time since 2015 (4-0) and the seventh time in program history (1990, 4-0; 1986, 4-0; 1985, 4-0; 1967, 8-0; 1910, 5-0). It went 4-0 to start league play for just the third time (1987, 4-0; 1967, 5-0).
- With its win at Michigan State, IU earned its first triumph as a Top-10 team since Nov. 11, 1967, also in East Lansing (14-13).
- The Hoosiers set their largest margin of victory on the road in the MSU series, blanked the Spartans for the first time since 1993, and recorded their first road shutout since Oct. 23, 1993, at Northwestern (24-0).
- With its victory over No. 8 Penn State, Indiana has won 15 of their last 17 season openers, and it is 43-18 in Memorial Stadium openers with wins in 17 of its last 19 and 34 of its last 39.
- IU's previous win over a ranked opponent came against No. 17 Michigan State in Bloomington, 24-21, in overtime on Oct. 1, 2016. This also marked the Hoosiers last win in a conference opener.
- Indiana improved to 5-7 in OT games with two-straight wins (44-41 double OT at Purdue - Nov. 30, 2019).
- IU's all-time record as a ranked team is 28-22-1.
- True freshmen WR **David Baker**, RB **Tim Baldwin Jr.**, TE **AJ Barner**, S **Bryson Bonds**, K **Chris Freeman**, OL **Randy Holtz**, CB **Christopher Keys**, DL **Damarjhe Lewis**, WR **Javon Swinton** and CB **Lem Watley-Neely** have seen action this year.
- The team voted center **Harry Crider**, linebacker **Cam Jones**, defensive back **Marcelino McCrary-Ball**, linebacker **Micah McFadden** and quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** season captains.
- The Hoosiers posted an 8-5 record and a 5-4 Big Ten mark en route to an appearance in the 2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl against Tennessee, the program's first bowl game in the state of Florida.
- IU won eight games for just the eighth time in program history and the first time since 1993.
- Indiana's five-conference wins tied for the third-most in program history (1945, 1979, 1988, 1991, 1993, 2019).
- The Hoosiers posted a winning conference record for the first time since 1993 (5-3).
- On Nov. 10, 2019, IU entered the AP Poll (No. 24) for the first time since Sept. 20, 1994, and the Coaches Poll (No. 25) for the first time since Oct. 17, 1994.
- **Tom Allen** promoted **Nick Sheridan** (bio on page 4) to offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach on Jan. 10, 2020. Sheridan takes over for 2019 Broyles Award semifinalist and Fresno State head coach Kalen DeBoer.
- Allen added three new coaches to the staff: **Jason Jones** (safeties), **Kevin Peoples** (defensive line) and **Kevin Wright** (tight ends).
- Jones brings 17 years of experience to Bloomington, including eight in the SEC and five in the Big 12. He has mentored four Jim Thorpe Award semifinalists and a Bronko Nagurski Award finalist.

Peoples owns 27 years of experience and arrives at IU after four seasons in the same capacity at Tulane. He tutored a pair of NFL standouts over his stint in New Orleans: end Ade Aruna (Vikings) and tackle Tanzel Smart (Rams).

Wright is a 20-year head coaching veteran with 13 of those seasons in the state of Indiana and the last five at IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla. Four of his IMG alumni were selected in the 2020 NFL Draft to give Wright 12 current or former NFL players.

**Kasey Teegardin** (bio on page 17) also earned a promotion to special teams coordinator on Jan. 19, 2020.

- **Tom Allen's** son, Thomas, is an IU redshirt junior linebacker. Tom is one of four FBS coaches to coach his son:
  - \*Dana and Logan Holgorsen (Houston)
  - \*Phillip and Cannon Montgomery (Tulsa)
  - \*Dabo, Will and Drew Swinney (Clemson)
- Fourteen Hoosiers are currently on NFL rosters: RB **Tevin Coleman** (49ers), LB **Chris Covington** (Colts), OL **Dan Feeney** (Chargers), LS **Dan Godsil** (Bengals), RB **Jordan Howard** (Eagles), OL **Brandon Knight** (Cowboys), WR OL **Wes Martin** (Washington), OL **Rodger Saffold** (Titans), LB **Trey Scales** (Steelers), OL **Jason Spriggs** (Packers), OL **Simon Stepaniak** (Packers), QB **Nate Sudfeld** (Eagles), TE **Ian Thomas** (Panthers) and **Nick Westbrook** (Titans).

Stepaniak was selected in the 2020 NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers in the sixth round (209th pick), while Westbrook signed a free-agent deal with the Titans.

- Former IU quarterback **Antwaan Randle El** (1998-2001) is on the 2020 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame for the ninth-consecutive year.
- He earned All-Big Ten distinction in 1999, 2000 and 2001, and he was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1998. The Big Ten MVP and first-team All-American in 2001, Randle El was also sixth in Heisman Trophy balloting after he finished 13th in 2000.
- The Riverdale, Ill., native was the first player in NCAA history to score 40 touchdowns (45) and throw for 40 TDs (42), the first to record over 2,500 total yards in four seasons, and the first to both pass for over 6,000 yards and rush for over 3,000 yards.
- The entire football team registered to vote. "Our whole objective, I want our guys to execute their right and their privilege to be able to vote in our democracy," **Tom Allen** said. "We never tell them who to vote for. We talk about the challenge of being able to study and know the issues and vote for the person and individuals that you believe represent what you want."

**DEFENSE**

- After three years running the defense, **Tom Allen** turned over the reins to **Kane Wommack** in 2019, who was named South Alabama's head coach on Dec. 12, and will remain with the Hoosiers through the end of the year.
- The youngest FBS head coach (33) and 2020 Broyles Award finalist, has his charges leading the Big Ten in interceptions (17, 1st nationally), opponent red zone scores (57.9, 1st), sacks (3.3, T-8th) and takeaways (20, T-10th), third in opponent passing efficiency (115.7, 15th), fourth in scoring defense (19.4, 19th), opponent completion percentage (57.1, T-26th) and opponent third-down conversions (36.7, 32nd), fifth in rush defense (135.7, T-32nd) and sixth in total defense (361.7, 36th).
- A program record seven Hoosier defenders earned All-Big Ten honors, including a program record four first-teams: fifth-year senior defensive tackle **Jerome Johnson** (1st), junior linebacker **Micah McFadden** (1st), junior safety **Jamar Johnson** (1st), sophomore cornerback **Tiawan Mullen** (1st), junior cornerback **Jaylin Williams** (2nd), junior safety **Devon Matthews** (3rd) and junior linebacker **Cam Jones** (honorable mention).
- McFadden earned third-team AP All-America honors.
- Indiana's 17 picks are tied for the third-most in school history (19 in 1998 and 2007).
- In its 24-0 shutout of Michigan State, IU did not allow the Spartans to advance beyond the Hoosiers 38-yard line, limited them to 191 yards (60 rushing) and recorded four takeaways (3 INTs) for the first time since Nov. 10, 2018.
- Indiana's five shutouts since the start of 2017 share first nationally with Alabama, Georgia, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin.
- IU limited No. 16 Wisconsin to six points, the fewest points the Badgers have scored in the series since 1992 (3) and the first time they failed to reach the end zone since Oct. 3, 2015, vs. Iowa.
- Over the past two seasons, the Hoosiers have held six opponents, including four Big Ten teams, to six points or fewer, the most in the league. Wisconsin ranks second (4) with Ohio State and Iowa in third (3).
- Indiana created two takeaways (1 INT, 1 FR) for the ninth-straight game, a program record.
- IU has at least one takeaway in 36 of the last 38 games, including each of the last 15, a school record, and it has an interception in a program-record 10-straight contests.
- The Hoosiers have scored 65 points off of their 20 takeaways.

- Indiana picked off three passes for the fourth time this season and for the third time in as many games in the Maryland win, which is believed to be a school record, and was the longest streak in the B1G since Wisconsin in 2016.
- It also recorded three INTs at Rutgers, at MSU and at No. 3 Ohio State.
- IU had a pair of picks in a program-record seven-straight games and became the first team since Oklahoma State in 2011 with at least two interceptions in six-consecutive games in the same year, also a school record.
- The Hoosiers held the Wolverines to just 13 yards rushing, believed to be the lowest yardage output by a Michigan team in 69 games in the series.
- U-M's 13 rushing yards were the lowest allowed by Indiana since William & Mary (-32) on Aug. 31, 2002, and the fewest by a B1G foe since Purdue (-8) on Nov. 24, 2001.
- In 2019, Wommack led the defense to Top-50 finishes nationally in scoring, total, rush and pass defense for the first time since 1993.
- Indiana last ranked in the Top 50 in scoring defense in 1993 and rush defense in 1998.
- The Hoosiers finished tied for 12th nationally in defensive touchdowns (3, T-3rd Big Ten), tied for 27th nationally in fumbles recovered (10, T-4th), 34th in opponent third-down conversions (35.2, 5th), 36th in total defense (352.2), tied for 38th in opponent first downs (19.1), 43rd in rush defense (138.5), 45th in scoring defense (24.4), 46th in pass defense (213.7) and 48th in pass efficiency defense (128.01).
- IU held four opponents: Eastern Illinois (52-0), Connecticut (38-3), Rutgers (35-0) and Northwestern (34-3), to three points or less, which marked the most in one campaign since holding five to three or less in 1945.
- Indiana was one of seven teams (Wisconsin-4, Florida-3, Georgia-3, Iowa-2, Utah-2, Virginia Tech-2) with two shutouts.
- IU held four foes under 200 total yards, four under 115 passing yards and five to 100-or-fewer rushing yards.
- Wommack and Allen stress the importance of takeaways and their magic number per game is three.
- The defense has reached that number 16 times since Allen brought the 4-2-5 to IU in 2016.
- Since the start of that campaign (57 games), Indiana has five games with four takeaways, 17 with at least three takeaways and 29 with multiple takeaways.
- Wommack worked with Allen as an Ole Miss graduate assistant in 2012-13, when Allen was linebackers coach under defensive coordinator Dave Wommack, Kane's father.

**OFFENSE**

- **Nick Sheridan** took over IU's offense after 2019 Broyles Award semifinalist Kalen DeBoer was named Fresno State's head coach in December of 2019.
- Senior **Ty Fryfogle** earned third-team Associated Press All-America honors, became the first wideout in program history to be named the Big Ten's Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year, and he claimed first-team all-conference honors.
- Junior running back **Stevie Scott III** and redshirt sophomore **Michael Penix Jr.** carded second-team All-Big Ten honors, while redshirt junior tight end **Peyton Hendershot** collected third-team accolades.
- Senior center **Harry Crider** and senior wide receiver **Whop Philyor** received honorable-mention recognition.
- The Hoosiers have reached 30 points four times in 2020 and 13 times since the start of 2019, which shares second (Minnesota) in the Big Ten to Ohio State's 17.
- They lead the conference in fewest sacks allowed (1.14, 12th nationally), interceptions lost (tied with 4, T-21st), and 30-yard passing plays (tied with 13), rank second in 60-yarders (4, T-7th nationally), 50-yarders (6, T-15th) and 40-yarders (tied with 6), rank third in passing (258.0, 39th) and scoring (30.1), and rank sixth in time of possession (30:37) and red zone conversions (81.8).
- Indiana threw for 342 yards in its victory over No. 23 Michigan, the program's second-highest passing yardage

- against U-M in 69 all-time meetings, for 320 in the win at Michigan State, and for 491 at No. 3 Ohio State, the most in 94 all-time meetings, the second-highest total in program history and the fourth-most ever allowed by OSU.
- IU posted 460 total yards against the Wolverines, 433 against the Spartans and 490 against the Buckeyes.
- A week after throwing for 491 yards, the Hoosiers racked up a season-high 234 rushing yards in the Maryland win.
- Working closely alongside DeBoer last season, IU improved at least 40 spots in the national rankings from 2018 in time of possession (+87), average yards per pass (+83), average yards per reception (+78), red zone touchdowns (+70), 20-yard passing plays (+69), 20-yard scrimmage plays (+62), points per game (+46) and total touchdowns (+43).
- Sheridan is in his fourth year in Bloomington. He coached the tight ends in 2019, and the quarterbacks in 2017-18.
- The Saline, Mich., native worked as an offensive graduate assistant at the University of Tennessee from 2014-16.
- Sheridan (32) was named one of the nation's Top 30 coaches under 30 years of age by 247Sports in 2017.
- A quarterback at the University of Michigan (2006-09), he appeared in 12 games and made four starts.
- Sheridan's father, Bill, is a 35-year NFL and collegiate coaching veteran, currently serving as the defensive line coach at the Air Force Academy.

**QUARTERBACK**

- Before he suffered a season-ending ACL injury in the Maryland win (Nov. 28), **Michael Penix Jr.**, who was one of 17 semifinalists for the Davey O'Brien Award and a second-team All-Big Ten selection, ran for one touchdown with :22 remaining, threw for a TD in overtime and then converted the ensuing two-point conversions following both scores to lift Indiana to a 36-35 victory over No. 8 Penn State.
- In the victory over No. 23 Michigan, the southpaw completed 30-of-50 for 342 yards, the second-highest yardage for a Hoosier against the Wolverines, with three touchdowns.
- Following the win, Penix was named the Manning Award Quarterback of the Week and recognized on the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award's Great 8 list.
- At Michigan State, Penix finished with 320 yards on 25-of-38 (65.8 percent) with two TDs.
- He turned in a career day at No. 3 Ohio State and secured his second O'Brien Great 8 honor, throwing for a career-high 491 yards (2nd in program history, 1st in Big Ten/5th nationally in 2020) with a career-best five scores (T-3rd in program history, T-1st in Big Ten/T-7th nationally in 2020) on 27-of-51 (career-high attempts).
- It marked his third-straight 300-yard game, and Penix became just the second Hoosier to accomplish the feat (**Nate Sudfeld**, 3 in 2015).
- His three-game total of 1,153 yards is the second-best total in program history (**Ben Chappell** - 1,188 in 2010).
- The 491 yards are the most against OSU at Ohio Stadium since 1985 (Jim Everett, 497) and the fourth-highest put up against the Buckeyes, including the most by an IU QB.
- Penix became the fourth to throw at least five touchdowns against Ohio State and the first since Iowa's Nate Stanley (5) on Nov. 14, 2017.
- The redshirt sophomore ended the year 124-of-220 (56.4) for 1,645 yards with 14 TDs and four interceptions, and he rushed for a pair of scores en route being named to the Davey O'Brien Award Class of 2020.
- Entering the Maryland game, he led the league in passing yardage, passing yardage per game (312.2, 9th nationally), passing touchdowns, completions, attempts, 60-yard passing plays (4, T-2nd), 50-yarders (6, T-7th), 40-yarders (tied 6, T-33rd) and 30-yarders (11, T-39th).
- Penix owns a 10-2 record as a starter and is 255-of-414 (61.6, 2nd in program history) for 3,258 yards with 25 TDs, eight INTs and a 143.8 pass-efficiency rating in 15 games.
- He has 189 yards on the ground on 47 attempts (4.0 average) with four scores.
- Penix completed 110-of-160 passes, good for a school-record 68.8 completion percentage (6th in Big Ten history), for 1,394 yards with 10 touchdowns, four picks and a 157.56 pass-efficiency rating in six starts in 2019. He rushed for 119 yards on 22 attempts (5.4) with two TDs.
- Penix suffered a season-ending right sternoclavicular joint injury in the Northwestern win on Nov. 2.
- A 2020 Maxwell Award Watch Lister, the 6-3 Penix gained 16 pounds over his 202-pound playing weight from last year.
- In 2019, Penix twice claimed Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors (Ball State, Michigan State).
- He averaged 232.3 passing yards and 252.2 total yards per game.
- Penix became the first IU freshman to start the opening game at quarterback since Antwaan Randle El in 1998.
- The Tampa native joined Randle El as the only freshman to surpass 300 passing yards in his first start and is one of just four freshmen to ever reach the benchmark (Kellen Lewis, Bob Hoernschemeyer).
- Penix finished with 326 yards on 24-of-40 with a 75-yard score. He added 67 yards on the ground for 393 total yards.
- His total yardage and passing yardage trail only Randle El for the most in a freshman debut. Randle El posted 467 total yards and 385 passing yards against Western Michigan on Sept. 12, 1998.

- In his first career road start at No. 25 Michigan State, he went 33-of-42 (78.6) for 286 yards with three passing scores and one rushing touchdown.
- Penix completed a school-record 20-straight passes, the second-longest streak in Big Ten history behind Chuck Long's 22-straight in 1984.
- His 33 completions were a career-high and share seventh on the program's single-game list.
- Penix threw for 61 scores and just six interceptions in his two years as a starter (24 games) at Tampa Bay Technical High School.
- The team captain added 16 touchdowns on the ground. He also played center field, jumped 22 feet in the long jump and tallied a time of 22.8 in the 200-meter dash.
- **Jack Tuttle** relieved Penix against the Terrapins and went 5-of-5 for 31 yards with a two-point conversion in his season debut.
- He led the Hoosiers to a 14-6 win at No. 16 Wisconsin in his first career start.
- The 6-4, 210-pound right-hander completed 13-of-22 for 130 yards with two touchdowns and zero interceptions.
- Tuttle made his IU debut against Eastern Illinois in 2019.
- The redshirt sophomore transferred from the University of Utah on Dec. 17, 2018, practiced with team and was ruled eligible for the 2019 campaign in the spring. He did not see action at Utah.
- In five games last season, Tuttle went 6-of-11 for 34 yards and had nine rushes for 20 yards.
- A graduate of Mission Hills High School in San Marcos, Calif., Tuttle was a Rivals and 247Sports four-star prospect.
- He was ranked the No. 4 pro-style quarterback nationally by Rivals, the No. 5 pro-style quarterback nationally by 247Sports and the No. 13 player in California by 247Sports.
- Tuttle's father, Jay, was a walk-on kicker at IU (1986-88).

**WIDE RECEIVER**

- **Ty Fryfogle** earned third-team Associated Press All-America honors, became the first wideout in program history to be named the Big Ten's Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year, and he claimed first-team all-conference honors.
- One of 11 semifinalists for the 2020 Biletnikoff Award, Fryfogle also became the first receiver in B1G history to record back-to-back 200-yard games, the first Indiana wideout to reach 200 yards twice and the first Hoosier since **Nate Sudfeld** (2015) to claim back-to-back Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- At No. 3 Ohio State, Fryfogle hauled in seven passes for 218 yards (5th in program history, 1st in the Big Ten/15th nationally in 2020) and three touchdowns (T-2nd in program history, T-1st in Big Ten/T-7th nationally in 2020).
- His 218 yards were the third-highest total ever vs. the Buckeyes, the most by a Hoosier vs. OSU and the fifth-highest total in program history.
- The senior scored from 63, 56 and 33 yards out and became the first Hoosier since **James Hardy** on Sept. 1, 2007, vs. Indiana State to bring in a pair of 50-yard TDs.
- En route to his first Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honor at Michigan State, Fryfogle set a career-high with 11 receptions (T-4th in the Big Ten in 2020) for 200 yards (2nd), eighth in program history, and reached the end zone twice, including a career-long 65-yarder.
- His 178 first-half yards marked the most by a Big Ten player (Roy Roundtree, Michigan) since 2010.
- The 6-2, 214-pounder has caught at least one TD in four of his last six contests and has surpassed the century mark in three of his last five games (4 times in his career).
- He became the first Hoosier since **Cody Latimer** (2013) with a score in four straight (Rutgers-Ohio State) and with three-consecutive 100-yarders (Michigan-Ohio State)
- Fryfogle made seven grabs for 142 yards with a 24-yard touchdown in the win over No. 23 Michigan to give him 25 for 560 and six TDs over a three-week stretch (Michigan-Ohio State).
- The 560 yards were the most over a three-game span in program history and the six scores were the most since Hardy's eight (2006).
- Fryfogle owns 109 receptions (8th among active Big Ten wideouts), 1,685 yards (5th) and 13 touchdowns (T-8th), and he is the 21st Hoosier to reach 1,500 yards and 100 catches.
- The Lucedale, Miss., native leads the team with 687 yards (2nd in the Big Ten), seven TDs (3rd, T-24th nationally), 20.2 yards per grab (1st, 12th) and 98.1 yards per game (5th, 25th), and he is second with 34 receptions.
- Fryfogle paces the B1G in 30-plus yard grabs (7, T-23rd nationally), is second in 20-yarders (13, T-22nd), tied for second in 60-yarders (2, T-6th), and tied for third in 40-yarders (3) and 50-yarders (3, T-16th).
- In 2019, Fryfogle finished third on the team with 45 catches and 604 yards to go along with three scores.
- Senior **Whop Philyor** is Indiana's leader with 162 receptions (3rd-most among active Big Ten wideouts, 21st nationally), 1,986 yards (3rd), seven 100-yard games and six double-digit catch games. He owns 12 touchdowns (T-10th).
- Philyor is the program's leader in double-figure catch games, shares fourth in 100-yard games, is fifth in receptions and is 11th in yardage.
- He notched his seventh 100-yarder with 137 yards on five grabs, including a 63-yarder, in the win at Rutgers, and followed that up with his sixth double-digit catch game with 11 for 79 against the Wolverines.
- Philyor leads the team with 36 receptions (T-8th in the Big Ten) and is second with 414 yards (13th) to go along with an 11.5 average and three TDs, the first of which came in overtime and set up **Michael Penix Jr.'s** game-winning two-point conversion vs. No. 8 Penn State.
- The Tampa native was named to the 2020 Maxwell Award and Biletnikoff Award Watch Lists and earned honorable-mention All-Big Ten honors.
- A second-team All-B1G selection, Philyor caught 70 passes for 1,002 yards and five scores one season ago.

- He became the seventh Hoosier to reach 1,000 yards, recorded three double-digit catch games, an IU single-season record, and was one of 10 FBS players with a trio of contests with 10-or-more.
- Philyor posted four 100-yard games (T-4th in the Big Ten). His receptions are sixth, 100-yarders share sixth and yardage is seventh on the program's single-season lists.
- The 5-11, 180-pounder finished third in the conference in catches and receptions per game (5.8), and fourth in yardage and yardage per game (83.5).
- His 502 yards after the catch topped the league (24th nationally), and he led the team (10th in the Big Ten) with 1,094 all-purpose yards (91.2 per game) after he rushed 10 times for 43 yards and returned 15 punts for 49 yards.
- At Nebraska, Philyor matched a career-high set earlier in the year at No. 25 Michigan State with 14 receptions (T-1st in the Big Ten, T-5th nationally in 2019) and had his second-best career yardage mark with 178 (7th in the Big Ten).
- Philyor became the first Hoosier to record double-figure catch games in back-to-back weeks with 10 in the Rutgers win after he hauled in the 14 against the Spartans.
- He topped 100 yards with 142 at MSU, with a career-best two TDs, and a career-high 182 (6th-most) against the Scarlet Knights.
- Philyor also brought in 10-plus completions vs. MSU in 2018 (13 for 148) and at Maryland in 2017 (13 for 127). His 14 receptions share third and the 13 share fifth on Indiana's single-game charts.
- His parents began calling him Whop because of his love for Burger King's Whoppers. Philyor's full name is Mister Elias De'Angelo Philyor.
- Redshirt sophomore **Miles Marshall** came on strong at the end of 2019, as he posted career-bests with four catches and 49 yards in his first career start and regular-season finale victory at Purdue.
- The Lilburn, Ga., native appeared in all 13 games and made 16 receptions for 196 yards and one touchdown.
- He opened 2020 with four catches for a team-high 46 yards in the win over No. 8 Penn State, and he added four for 47 against the Spartans.
- Marshall again matched his career-high with four receptions for a career-best 89 yards, including a career-long 68-yarder against the Buckeyes.
- He is third on the team with 257 yards on 17 catches (15.1 average) with one score overall.

**RUNNING BACK**

- A 2019 and 2020 second-team All-Big Ten selection and member of the 2019 and 2020 Maxwell Award and Doak Award Watch Lists, **Stevie Scott III** became the 14th Hoosier to reach 2,000 rushing yards and currently sits 10th all-time at 2,444.
- He is the Big Ten's active leader in attempts (543, 15th nationally), and he is second in rushing touchdowns (28, T-17th), total TDs (30, 19th) and rushing yards (26th).
- After crossing the goal line a career-high three times in the Maryland win, Scott is tied for fourth in program history in rushing scores, tied for fifth in total touchdowns (28 rushing, 2 receiving) and tied for 10th with nine 100-yarders.
- The junior has scored in 16 of his last 23 contests (24 rushing, 1 receiving) and owns eight multi-TD career games, including three in 2020 (No. 8 Penn State-2, No. 23 Michigan-2 and Maryland-3).
- En route to Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors, Scott also added 80 rushing yards against the Terrapins. He now has two POW honors in his career to go along with two B1G Freshman of the Week accolades.
- Scott has reached 80 yards in four of the last six weeks (81, 97, 84, 80), and he is eighth in the B1G with 462 yards, tied for second in rushing touchdowns (7), third in attempts (137) and tied for fourth in total TDs (tied, 8)
- He also has 11 receptions for 52 yards and is second on the team with 73.4 all-purpose yards per game.
- Scott rushed for 845 yards on 178 attempts (4.7 average) with 10 scores one year ago.
- He averaged 76.8 rushing yards per game and led the team with 96.0 all-purpose yards per game and 11 total TDs.
- Scott finished fourth in the Big Ten in rushing yards per game, fifth in carries, tied for fifth in rushing scores, tied for sixth in total touchdowns and 10th in all-purpose yardage per game despite missing the final two games due to injury.
- The Syracuse, N.Y., native reached the century mark three times and collected three multi-TD contests.
- Scott shared third among all B1G backs with 26 catches and was fifth with 211 yards to go along with one score.
- The 6-2, 231-pounder is averaging 4.5 yards per carry, 81.5 rushing yards and 93.1 all-purpose yards in 30 career games (29 starts).
- In 2018, Scott turned in one of the top true freshman running back campaigns in program history.
- He set Indiana true freshman records with 1,137 yards (losing just 18 yards), 228 attempts, 10 touchdowns and six 100-yard games.
- Scott averaged 94.8 rushing yards, 101.9 all-purpose yards per game and 5.0 yards per carry.
- He became the 13th Hoosier (19th time) to reach 1,000 yards and his 1,137 yards rank 14th.
- Amongst true freshmen running backs nationally, Scott finished second in rushing yardage, 100-yard games and rushes, and third in rushing TDs.
- He finished fourth in the league in attempts (19.0, 23rd nationally), tied for fourth in rushing scores, fifth in rushing yardage (33rd) and rushing yardage per game (27th), eighth in all-purpose yardage (1,223), tied for eighth in total TDs (11) and 10th in all-purpose yardage per game (101.9).
- Scott tallied 204 yards, three shy of Anthony Thompson's Hoosiers true freshman record (1988), on 31 carries (6.6 average) with his first career score, a 40-yarder, in a 20-16 victory vs. Virginia.
- IU's Offensive Newcomer of the Year was a 2016 all-state and All-Central New York selection as a back and linebacker before he was limited to three games due to injury in 2017 at Christian Brothers Academy.
- Sophomore **Sampson James** finished second on the team with 81 carries, 275 yards and three touchdowns in 13 games (2 starts) one season ago.
- James filled in for Scott at Purdue and he became the 13th Hoosier true freshman to reach the 100-yard mark.
- He rushed a career-high 22 times for 118 yards (5.4) and one TD in the victory.
- The 6-1, 220-pounder participated in 2019 spring practice after a distinguished career at Avon (Ind.) High School.

- A two-time all-stater, James was a consensus four-star prospect by ESPN, Rivals and 247Sports.
- He closed out his Avon career with 3,451 yards on 573 carries (6.0 average) with 38 rushing touchdowns and 41 total scores.
- **David Ellis** moved from wide receiver to running back during 2020 spring practice.
- The sophomore out of Clinton Township, Mich., rushed nine times for 53 yards in 2019, but he missed the first three games of 2020 due to injury before he returned at MSU.
- Ellis, who made 16 receptions for 173 yards last season, caught four passes for a career-high 86 yards with his first career receiving touchdown at No. 3 Ohio State.
- He has 11 carries for 45 yards and 10 grabs for 118 yards and the TD in four games.
- Ellis saw time at running back, wide receiver, defensive back and kick returner at Chippewa Valley High School, where he became the 11th player in state history with a 99-yard scoring rush.
- **Tim Baldwin Jr.** carried the ball 16 times for a game-high 106 yards, both career-best efforts, against Maryland.
- He became the 14th IU true freshman to hit the century mark after he posted just three carries for 18 yards in his previous lone appearance at Michigan State.
- Baldwin, a native of Nokesville, Va., was a first-team all-state honoree at Patriot High School, where he rushed for 1,604 yards on 233 carries with 25 scores as a senior.
- A 2018 Broyles Award nominee, **Mike Hart** is in his fourth season as Indiana's running backs coach and his first as associate head coach.
- The University of Michigan's all-time rushing leader, Hart spent three years with the Indianapolis Colts before entering the coaching ranks in 2011.
- In his nine years as a coach (Syracuse, 2016; Western Michigan, 2014-15; Eastern Michigan, 2011-13), Hart has tutored four 1,000-yard rushers, two Mid-American Conference (MAC) Freshman of the Year honorees and the 2014 MAC Offensive Player of the Year, Jarvion Franklin.
- Each of the Hoosiers last four featured running backs have reached the NFL - **Devine Redding** (Kansas City, Tampa Bay), **Jordan Howard** (Philadelphia), **Tevin Coleman** (San Francisco) and **Stephen Houston** (New England, Pittsburgh and Baltimore).

- Indiana returned 126 career starts from 12 players on offense and 163 career starts from 16 players on defense for a total of 289 career starts from 28 players.
- The offensive line is the team's most experienced unit with 81 career starts among seven players.
- On defense, the secondary is the most experienced unit with 124 career starts among nine different players.
- Across both lines, IU owns 188 career starts among 18 players.

**TIGHT END**

- **Peyton Hendershot** entered 2020 as a member of the John Mackey Award Watch List and claimed third-team All-Big Ten honors for the second-straight campaign.
- He posted his first career two-touchdown game in the Rutgers victory and has four TDs overall this year to put him second on the program's career list for tight ends in scores (10). **Ted Bolser** (2010-13) is the all-time leader with 15.
- Hendershot added a game-high six receptions vs. RU, and he is third in catches (90) and yardage (936).
- In 2020, Hendershot is second on the Hoosiers with his four touchdowns, which shares first in the Big Ten among tight ends (T-8th overall) and 17th nationally. He is third on the team with 23 catches, which is tied for third among conference tight ends, and fourth with 151 yards.
- One year ago, he set Indiana single-season tight end records with 52 receptions (10th in the Big Ten) and 622 yards, and he tied for third with four TDs in his 13 starts.
- The redshirt junior tied for fourth among tight ends nationally in catches and 10th in yardage.
- Hendershot finished second among Big Ten tight ends in receptions and yardage, and tied for third in scores.
- He ranked second on the Hoosiers in catches and yardage, and shared third in touchdowns.
- The North Salem, Ind., native led the team in receptions seven times (7 times game-high) and in yardage four times (2 times game-high), while he posted seven games with 50-or-more yards and six games with five-or-more catches.
- He nearly became the first Hoosier tight end since 1985 (**Dave Lilja**) and the fifth overall to reach the century mark at Maryland, where he posted a career-high 95 yards on six grabs, both game-highs, in the win.
- Against No. 6 Ohio State, he collected 70 yards, including a career-long 49-yard TD, on four receptions.

- Junior **Matt Bjorson** pulled in seven passes for 36 yards with one touchdown last season.
- Overall, he has played in 32 games with 13 catches for 100 yards and the score.

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

- Despite using five different line combinations in seven games, Indiana leads the Big Ten in fewest sacks allowed (1.14, 12th nationally), ranks third in passing (258.0, 39th) and scoring (30.1), and ranks sixth in time of possession (30:37) and red zone conversions (81.8).
- Senior **Harry Crider** (34 career games) and redshirt junior **Caleb Jones** (28) were the only two IU linemen who started all 13 games in 2019.
- Crider, a 2020 honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection, made 12 starts at left guard and one at center, where he has taken over in 2020.
- The 6-4, 311-pounder attended Columbus East High School in Columbus, Ind.
- He was a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award, a nominee for the Wuerffel Trophy, and the Senior CLASS Award, a Rimington Trophy Watch Lister, and he was a William V. Campbell Trophy semifinalist and a candidate for the AFCA Allstate Good Works Team.
- Crider graduated with a criminal justice degree in Dec. 2019, and he is pursuing his master's in criminal justice and public safety.
- He was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes as a 10-year old and helped collect over \$16,000 to raise awareness to the disease for his high school senior project.
- Jones (6-8, 362), a 2019 honorable-mention All-Big Ten honoree, started 12 games at right tackle and one at left tackle, where he started the first three games of 2020 before missing the next three.
- In his return at No. 16 Wisconsin, Jones started on the right side.
- He was an all-state standout in 2015 and 2016 at Lawrence North High School in Indianapolis.
- **Luke Haggard** (6-7, 275) made his first start as a Hoosier for Jones against the Spartans and has remained at left tackle since.
- A junior out of Santa Rosa (Calif.) Junior College, Haggard enrolled in 2020 spring classes and participated in practice.

- Sophomore **Matthew Bedford** started the first six games right tackle before missing the Badgers game.
- IU's 2019 Offensive Newcomer of the Year started eight times and played in nine at left tackle as a true freshman.
- Bedford (6-6, 314) chose the Hoosiers over Mississippi State and South Carolina.
- Redshirt freshman **Mike Katic** made the first starts of his career at left guard in the first two games this season and the last two contests, while **Mackenzie Nworah** (14 starts, 26 games) started at right guard the first five games.
- Fifth-year senior **Dylan Powell**, a transfer from Stanford University this offseason, has made his first starts as a Hoosier (8 overall) the last five games with the first three at left guard and the last two at right guard.
- In 2019, Indiana set a program mark with 3,931 passing yards, and finished third with 5,626 total yards and 413 points. The Hoosiers were second in the conference in pass offense (302.4, 15th nationally) and first downs (23.4, T-20th), third in total offense (432.8) and time of possession (33:44, 7th), and fifth in scoring offense (31.8).
- **Darren Hiller** is in his fourth season overseeing the offensive line. A 26-year coaching veteran, Hiller has coached 21 players who have moved on to the NFL, including former Hoosiers **Wes Martin** (guard), **Brandon Knight** (tackle) and **Simon Stepaniak** (guard).
- Stepaniak was a sixth-round selection by Green Bay in the 2020 NFL Draft, Martin was a fourth-round selection by Washington in 2019, and Knight was a 2019 free-agent signing of Dallas.
- Tackle **Jason Spriggs** (Chicago) and guard **Dan Feeney** (Los Angeles Chargers) were drafted in 2016 and 2017, respectively. Spriggs was taken with pick No. 48 (round 2 by Green Bay), and Feeney was selected with pick No. 71 (round 3 by Los Angeles).
- The quintet, along with **Rodger Saffold**, an 11-year veteran guard with Tennessee, gives Indiana six former O-line standouts currently on NFL rosters.

**LINEBACKER**

- In the middle, **Micah McFadden** earned 2020 first-team All-Big Ten and third-team Associated Press All-America honors.
- McFadden owns three double-digit tackle games in his career after he posted a game-high 10, all solos, with one for loss at No. 3 Ohio State.
- He followed that up with his second interception of the year and the fourth of his career in the win over Maryland.
- McFadden just missed double digits again in the victory at No. 16 Wisconsin with a team-best nine, and he delivered a pair of sacks for the second time in the last four games, his fifth career multi-TFL game.
- His performance earned him Walter Camp Foundation National Defensive Player of the Week honors and his first Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week accolade.
- The junior leads the team with 52 stops, 39 solos (4th in the Big Ten), five sacks (T-3rd) and 8.5 tackles for loss (T-7th) to go along with two INTs (T-8th) and three quarterback hurries.
- In the shutout at Michigan State, McFadden finished with a team-best nine tackles and added career-highs with two sacks and three for loss.
- He matched his career-best and finished with a game-high 11 stops, all solos (career-high), one for a loss, in the win over No. 8 Penn State.
- McFadden played in all 13 games (12 starts) and topped IU with 61 tackles, 42 solos, 10 for loss and two picks (tied) en route to being named Indiana's 2019 Most Outstanding Defensive Player of the Year
- He also posted 1.5 sacks, four quarterback hurries (3rd on the team) and one pass breakup.
- McFadden closed out 2019 with an interception, one TFL and five stops in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl vs. Tennessee.
- The 6-2, 235-pounder led the team in tackles four times, including in the win at Nebraska, where he made 11 and 10.
- He picked off his first career pass and carded six stops, all solos, with one for loss against No. 13 Michigan after he recorded one sack, 1.5 TFLs and a career-best three QBHs at No. 9 Penn State.
- McFadden registered a tackle for loss in nine contests, including three with 1.5 or more.
- As a true freshman, he posted 20 tackles, 14 solo, with one for loss, one forced fumble and two hurries in 12 games.
- The Tampa Plant grad tallied a program-record 211 tackles, 124 solo, 39 for loss, seven sacks, two picks and two fumble recoveries as a senior.
- Junior **Cam Jones**, a 2020 honorable-mention All-Big Ten honoree, shifted over from the husky position to stinger in 2019, and he made his first career start in the 2020 opener against the Nittany Lions, where he made a career-best seven tackles, one for loss, and matched a career-high with six solos.
- He made six stops with his second sack of the season at No. 3 Ohio State and a team-high six with two quarterback hurries in the win against the Terrapins.
- Jones has 30 tackles, 20 solo, two sacks, three TFLs, a team-high four QBHs and one pass breakup in seven starts.
- He had 35 stops, 23 solos, two sacks, 4.5 for loss, one pick-6, one forced fumble, two pass PBUs and two QB hurries in 12 games last year.
- With his forced fumble in the Northwestern win, he matched husky **Bryant Fitzgerald** and cornerback **Jaylin Williams** for third on the team with six career takeaways.
- Jones set a career-high with two sacks, the first two of his career, and six solos, while he added six total tackles against Rutgers.

- In the win over UConn, Jones picked off his second career pass and returned it 44 yards for six points.
- Jones was recognized as the team's 2018 defensive newcomer of the year after he shared the team lead with two forced fumbles (T-1st among Big Ten true freshmen, T-2nd among freshmen nationally, T-7th in the Big Ten overall) in 11 games.
- The Memphis, Tenn., native totaled 20 tackles, 15 solo, with one fumble recovery, one interception, one pass breakup and one QBH.
- Jones finished second on the team with four takeaways.
- **James Miller** posted a season-high six tackles in the win at MSU and has 20, 14 solo, in seven games (2 starts) this year.
- In his second start, against the Badgers, Miller posted five stops and recovered the first fumble of his career.
- He totaled 31 tackles, 19 solo, 4.5 for loss, a half-sack and a team-high-tying two forced fumbles playing behind McFadden one season ago.
- Miller netted a career-high seven stops with his second forced fumble at PSU.
- He delivered four tackles, one TFL and his first career forced fumble against the Cornhuskers.
- A 2018 two-time defensive scout team player of the week and one-time special teams scout team player of the week, the Tampa native (Armwood H.S.) chose the Hoosiers over Florida State.
- **Thomas Allen** forced his first career fumble against the Spartans before he suffered a season-ending injury for the second-straight campaign (at Nebraska on Oct. 26, 2019).
- He finished with 17 tackles and a half for loss in 2019, and he collected 28 stops, 20 solo, with one sack, three for loss, one INT (30 yards) and two hurries in 12 games in 2018.
- A three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, the redshirt junior is the son of head coach **Tom Allen**.
- Allen was a teammate of McFadden's at Plant.

**CORNERBACK**

- **Brandon Shelby** is in his 10th season as Indiana's cornerbacks coach.
- **Tiawan Mullen** became the program's first cornerback to earn first-team All-Big Ten honors since Tracy Porter in 2007 a year after he became the fourth Shelby protégé to lead the Big Ten in pass breakups in 2019.
- Mullen, IU's 2019 Defensive Newcomer of the Year, was a member of the 2020 Chuck Bednarik Award Watch List.
- He is second on the Hoosiers to safety **Jamar Johnson** (9) with eight career takeaways (3 INT, 3 FF, 2 FR) after he forced his first fumble of the season on a Graham Mertz sack in the win at No. 16 Wisconsin.
- Mullen is second on the team with 36 tackles, 25 solos (tied) and 4.5 for loss (tied), and third with three picks (T-6th in the Big Ten, T-27th nationally), 3.5 sacks (T-12th) and four PBUs (T-14th) in addition to the forced fumble.
- He leads all Big Ten defensive backs in sacks and TFLs.
- The Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native matched a career-high with eight stops, one for loss, in the season-opening victory over No. 8 Penn State.
- Mullen delivered seven tackles, five solo, with 2.5 sacks, the first of his career, in the win at Rutgers.
- In the victory at Michigan State, he recorded the first two interceptions of his career, the first Hoosier with a multi-INT game since Jonathan Crawford vs. Purdue on Nov. 26, 2016, and he picked off his third pass in the win over Maryland.
- A 247Sports True Freshman All-American, The Athletic Freshman All-American and honorable-mention All-B1G selection, Mullen not only paced the conference, but he finished second among freshmen nationally and shared 11th in the country with 13 breakups.
- He also shared the team lead with two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries (T-4th in the Big Ten, T-27th nationally) to go along with 29 stops, 25 solo, and 3.5 for loss in 13 games (8 starts).
- Mullen was a Rivals four-star prospect and played in the 2019 All-American Bowl after he picked off 14 career passes and returned three for scores.
- His brother, Trayvon, played cornerback at Clemson University (2016-18) and is a member of the Las Vegas Raiders, and his cousin (mother's side), Lamar Jackson, played at Louisville (2015-17) and is the Baltimore Ravens quarterback.
- Junior **Jaylin Williams**, a second-team All-Big Ten honoree, recorded an interception in each of the first three games of 2020.
- He added a fourth against the Terrapins, which puts him in a tie for the team lead (T-3rd in the Big Ten, T-5th nationally) with safety **Jamar Johnson**, and he is second to Johnson (94) with 93 return yards.
- Williams has six INTs in his career, which ranks second to Johnson's seven.
- At No. 3 Ohio State, Williams set a career-high with seven tackles and six solos with his first sack of the year (2nd of career).
- In four starts (7 games), he has 23 stops, 20 solo, one sack, two for loss, the four picks, one pass breakup and two quarterback hurries.
- The Memphis, Tenn., native started seven of the final eight games and appeared in all 13 last season.
- He posted 19 tackles, 15 solo, with one interception and three PBUs.
- Williams made 22 stops, 19 solo, one sack, one INT and two pass breakups as a true freshman.



- **Reese Taylor** enjoyed a successful transition to corner in 2019 after spending the 2018 campaign on offense. He switched to defense during 2019 spring practice.
- A week after he set a career-high with a team-high eight tackles and seven solos, one for loss, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry against the Scarlet Knights, Taylor again paced the Hoosiers with seven stops, all solos, his first career sack and a career-best two for loss in the win over No. 23 Michigan.
- He added his first career multi-takeaway game with his second career interception, which he returned 53 yards, and his first career forced fumble against the Spartans, in addition to one TFL.
- Taylor has 25 stops, 21 solo, four TFLs, one sack, one pick, five PBUs (2nd on the team, T-8th in the Big Ten), one forced fumble and one quarterback hurry in seven games (3 starts).
- He earned his first career start in the 2019 regular-season finale at Purdue and played in 11 games overall.
- Taylor recorded the first interception of his career with 1:00 left to seal the Hoosiers 34-28 win at Maryland, and the junior collected 13 tackles, one for loss, on the year.
- In 2018, Taylor posted 27 receptions for 166 yards, 15 rushes for 83 yards (5.5 average), three kick returns for 66 yards, seven tackles and was the team's back-up quarterback, the position where he earned Indiana's 2017 Mr. Football honors. He led Indianapolis Ben Davis High School to the 2017 state championship.
- The two-time all-stater broke the Ben Davis career marks with 7,631 passing yards and 79 passing scores on 568-of-828 (68.6 percent), and he rushed for 2,077 yards on 374 attempts (5.5 average) with 45 touchdowns.

- The move proved to be a wise one as Johnson collected first-team All-Big Ten honors, the first Hoosier first-teamer at safety since Eric Allen in 1996.
- En route to Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week honors in the victory over No. 8 Penn State, Johnson posted a career-high 10 tackles and seven solos.
- He recorded his first career multi-takeaway game after he picked off a pass that set up an Indiana touchdown and forced a fumble with PSU threatening inside the IU 10.
- Johnson added his first career multi-interception game with a pair at No. 3 Ohio State to go along with five solos, his first sack of the year and one pass breakup.
- The Sarasota, Fla., native joined cornerback **Jaylin Williams** atop the team with his fourth INT (T-3rd in the Big Ten, T-5th nationally) in the win at No. 16 Wisconsin.
- Johnson, who has returned those picks 94 yards, leads the Hoosiers with nine career takeaways and seven career interceptions.
- He is also tied for third on Indiana with 34 stops, tied for second with 25 solos, fifth with 3.5 TFLs and tied for third with three PBUs to go along with the forced fumble.
- Last season, Johnson made 25 tackles, 18 solo, three sacks (23 yards), 4.5 for loss (26 yards), two interceptions (1 pick-6), one forced fumble, two pass breakups and one quarterback hurry in 13 games.
- The junior recorded an INT in each of the final two games, including a 63-yard TD in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl vs. Tennessee, the first defensive score in IU postseason history.
- Third-team All-Big Ten selection **Devon "Monster" Matthews** handles strong safety duties for the second-straight year.
- The junior stuffed the stat sheet with eight tackles, his first career sack and two pass breakups in the season opener and added five solos, one for loss, with the second interception of his career in the win over No. 23 Michigan.
- Matthews shares third on the team with 34 stops and is fourth with 22 solos, and he leads the way with six PBUs (T-5th in the Big Ten) in addition to two tackles for loss, the sack, the INT and one QBH in seven starts.

- He posted 37 tackles, 26 solo, with two breakups in 13 games (6 starts) one year ago.
- The 6-2, 202-pounder collected career-highs in his first career start vs. Ball State in the season opener with nine stops and six solos, which he matched in the regular-season finale at Purdue.
- A Jacksonville, Fla., native, Matthews earned the nickname "Monster" as an 8-year old defensive end when he knocked a quarterback's helmet off on a sack.

**HUSKY**

- **Marcelino McCrary-Ball** suffered an ACL injury during practice in September. The fifth-year senior entered 2020 as the team leader in career tackles (201) and solo stops (142) with 38 starts at husky in 41 games.
- He shared the top spot with three interceptions and 13 pass breakups, and he was second in sacks (4.5) and tackles for loss (15.5).
- A two-time honorable-mention All-Big Ten recipient, Marcelino is the younger brother of Marcus, a former NFL defensive back who played at the University of Memphis (2009-10), Reggie Jr., a quarterback at Georgia Tech University (2003-06) and Raeshon, a defensive back at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga (2006-08).
- **Bryant Fitzgerald** has replaced Ball after he moved from safety to husky during 2020 spring practice and owns 13 stops, 12 solo, one for loss, with two PBUs in seven starts.
- The redshirt junior started eight games at free safety and played in 25 overall in 2018 and 2019. He did start one game at husky in 2018 at Rutgers.
- Fitzgerald topped the team with three picks (T-8th in the Big Ten), two forced fumbles (tied, T-7th in the Big Ten) and six takeaways as a redshirt freshman in 2018.
- The Indianapolis product out of Avon High School shared first in the Big Ten among freshmen in INTs (T-7th nationally) and forced fumbles (T-4th nationally), and he added one fumble recovery, 31 tackles, 24 solo and two for loss in 12 games (3 starts).
- Fitzgerald had 27 stops, 24 solo, one for loss, with three pass breakups and one quarterback hurry in 13 games (5 starts) last season.
- His six career takeaways share third on the team with junior linebacker **Cam Jones** and junior cornerback **Jaylin Williams**.

- First-year IU defensive line coach and 27-year veteran **Kevin Peoples** uses a 12-man rotation up front.
- Fifth-year senior tackle **Jerome Johnson** earned 2020 first-team All-Big Ten honors, the first Indiana tackle to collect first-team accolades since 1993 (Hurvin McCormack).
- Johnson set a career-high with two sacks, his third career multi-sack game, and matched his career-best with 2.5 tackles for loss in the win at Michigan State.
- He added his third sack of 2020 and his first career interception at No. 3 Ohio State, and he made it four sacks in three weeks with one in the Maryland win.
- Johnson is the team's active leader with 13.5 sacks (91 yards) and 21 TFLs (109 yards).
- He is second the team with his four sacks (T-8th in the Big Ten), and he leads the line with 4.5 stops for loss (T-2nd on the team) and 16 tackles to go along with one fumble recovery (vs. No. 8 Penn State) in six starts.
- The Bassfield, Miss., native has been named the program's most outstanding lineman two years running and has started 27 of the last 28 games.
- In 2019, Johnson posted 43 tackles, 20 solo, five sacks (46 yards), 7.5 for loss (51 yards) and two quarterback hurries.
- The 6-3, 304-pounder shared the team lead in sacks, finished second in TFLs and fifth in stops.
- Johnson led the defensive line in tackles and stops for loss, tied for first in sacks and shared second in solos.
- Joining Johnson in the interior is junior **Demarcus Elliott** (6-3, 311), an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection one season ago, who has started five games in 2020.
- Elliott made 35 tackles, 27 solo, with three sacks (17 yards), five for loss (29 yards), one forced fumble and one quarterback hurry in 13 games (12 starts).

- Elliott also led the team in stops on three occasions and posted six games with at least four.
- The Garden City, Kan., native played the 2018 campaign at Garden City Community College.
- Junior **James Head Jr.** picked up his first sack of the year in the Michigan win and is second on the line with 1.5 sacks, two stops for loss (tied) and 14 tackles in addition to a fumble recovery, the first of his career, against the Spartans, three hurries and one pass breakup.
- He has started each of the seven games in 2020 and 20 straight after he opened all 13 games at end in 2019, where he gathered 20 stops, 14 solo, 2.5 sacks, four for loss, five quarterback hurries (2nd on the team), three breakups and one forced fumble.
- Head's strip-sack at No. 9 Penn State resulted in his first career forced fumble in 2019, and he continued his success against the Nittany Lions with a career-high five tackles in the 2020 season opener.
- The 6-5, 259-pound Miami native made 17 stops in 11 games last year after a sterling career at Southridge High

- School. Head finished his career with 250 tackles, 47 for loss and 45 sacks.
- Stanford grad transfer **Jovan Swann** graduated with a human biology degree in April 2020, and he is currently enrolled in the IU Kelley School of Business MBA program.
  - The 6-2, 280-pound tackle made his first career start as a Hoosier in the win at Rutgers.
  - He owns 89 tackles, 51 solo, 11.5 sacks, 18.5 for loss, 11 quarterback hurries, four pass breakups, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, one interception and one blocked field goal in 46 games (20 starts).
  - Sophomore **D.K. Bonhomme** has started at defensive end two of the last three weekends, and he has posted nine tackles and a safety, coming against the Terrapins, during the three-game run.
  - The 6-3, 235-pound outside linebacker/end has 14 tackles, two for loss, and one sack in seven games overall.
  - Bonhomme attended Clearwater (Fla.) Academy International with IU defensive tackle **Sio Nofogato'a**.
  - He was born in Haiti, moved to Montreal at five years old and Ottawa at 15, and he is the first Canadian to join the Hoosiers since offensive lineman **Paul Hearn** (2003-06).
  - Bonhomme's primary language is French.



**SPECIALISTS**

- **Haydon Whitehead** was named one of 10 semifinalists for the 2020 Ray Guy Award.
- The four-time Ray Guy Award candidate (2017-20) and 2019 and 2020 honorable-mention All-Big Ten recipient was granted an extra year of eligibility on Nov. 14, 2019.
- Whitehead owns a 41.2 average (223 punts), third in program history, with 25 50-yarders. He has pinned 81 punts inside the 20-yard line, 37 inside the 10 and 15 inside the 5.
- He is averaging 42.4 yards on 36 punts with a long of 55, six 50-yarders and nine inside the 20 this year. Opponents have only returned two punts for 14 yards.
- In the win at No. 16 Wisconsin, Whitehead landed four of his five punts inside the 20, including at the 1- and 8-yard lines, with a long of 51 en route to his first career Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honor.
- Whitehead averaged 45.4 on seven punts with two 50-yarders in the Maryland victory and 46.2 on five punts with a pair of 50-yarders in the win at Michigan State.
- In 2019, Whitehead averaged a career-high 42.5 yards (5th in the Big Ten) on 51 punts. His average is seventh on IU's single-season list.
- He landed 27.5 percent (14-of-51) inside the 10-yard line, fifth in the FBS, and he pinned opponents inside the 20 on 22 occasions and inside the 5 six times.
- Whitehead blasted a career-best 10 50-yarders, including a career-long 65-yarder, and only five of his punts resulted in a touchback (9.8 percent), 20 resulted in a fair catch (39.2 percent) and just seven were returned (13.7 percent).
- In the season-opening win vs. Ball State, he averaged 51.7 yards (5th in program history) on three punts, including a 63-yarder, and had two inside the 10-yard line en route to being named one of the Ray Guy Award's Ray's 8.
- The Melbourne, Australia, native kicked in his first American football game ever in the 2017 season opener, and he went on to earn honorable-mention All-Big Ten (coaches and media).
- Whitehead, who punts left-footed but is able to kick right-footed if necessary, enrolled in 2017 spring classes and participated in practice.

- The 25-year old played Australian Rules Football for 15 years. He made his first trip to the United States when he took his official visit to IU in December 2016.
- Whitehead trained under Nathan Chapman and John Smith at Prokick Australia in Melbourne.
- **Charles Campbell** took over place-kicking duties after the graduation of two-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist **Logan Justus**, and he earned 2020 second-team All-Big Ten honors.
- Campbell was a perfect 21-for-21 in 2020 before he missed a 41-yard field goal in the win at Michigan State.
- He is 8-of-9 on field goals, including a career-long 52-yarder (T-6th in IU history) in the win over No. 23 Michigan, and 23-of-23 on extra points.
- The Jackson, Tenn., native is fourth among all Big Ten kickers with his 6.7 points per game and is tied for fifth with his 1.1 three-pointers per game.
- He opened the year with a 48-yard field goal and a 34-yarder in the win over No. 8 Penn State.
- Campbell added three more (T-10th in IU history) in the victory at Rutgers en route to Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week and Lou Groza Award Star of the Week honors.
- He made both of his field goal attempts, from 48 and 41 yards, and his lone PAT in 2019. He is 5-of-6 (83.3 percent) from 40-plus yards in his career.
- The redshirt sophomore was named IU's special teams player of the week in the win at Purdue.
- Campbell was a 2017 Tennessee Mr. Football finalist (kicker), three-time district kicker of the year and two-time all-state selection out of University School of Jackson.
- He was a U.S. Army All-American and kicked in the 2018 U.S. Army All-American Bowl.
- **Sean Wracher** earned third-team All-Big Ten honors from Phil Steele as a true freshman in 2019 and has started all 20 games since he arrived in Bloomington.
- The Akron, Ohio, native was a Kohl'sKicking.com five-star prospect and ranked the No. 1 long snapper nationally by Kornblue Kicking.

## IU UNVEILS GEORGE TALIAFERRO STATUE IN GEORGE TALIAFERRO PLAZA

Indiana University President Michael A. McRobbie presided over the dedication of the George Taliagerro Plaza on Friday, Nov. 1, 2019, unveiling a bronze statue of Taliagerro, one of the most important and influential individuals in the history of Indiana University and IU Athletics.

McRobbie led the dedication ceremony, which took place on the newly-dedicated plaza located on the ground level of Memorial Stadium outside of the North End Zone facility. Other speakers at the event included IU Board of Trustee member Quinn Buckner, Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass, head football coach Tom Allen, Senior Associate Athletic Director Anthony Thompson and fifth-year senior linebacker Reakwon Jones.

“Throughout his life, not only did George Taliagerro excel as an athlete, but he also overcame the real-world struggles of racism and prejudice, of segregation and oppression,” McRobbie said. “And in the process, he demonstrated courage, determination and perseverance, and earned a special place in the annals of our state and its flagship public university.”

“In George Taliagerro Plaza and its centerpiece statue, every visitor to Indiana Memorial Stadium will be reminded of the enormous contributions George made to IU and to this community, as an outstanding athlete, as a champion of racial equality, as a dedicated educator and administrator, as a tireless community activist, and as a friend and mentor to many.”

“It is fitting that during our Bicentennial year, we are dedicating this plaza and statue in honor of one of the most important figures in the history not only of Indiana University Athletics, but of Indiana University as a whole,” said Glass. “I am particularly grateful to President McRobbie and Trustee Buckner for their support in permanently and prominently recognizing this Hoosier pioneer at the entryway of IU Football where he will be seen every day by IU players, coaches, and recruits.”

Taliagerro, who passed away Oct. 8, 2018, at the age of 91, was a legendary Indiana University football player during the 1940s who shattered racial barriers on campus and in the sport. In doing so, he left an indelible mark on both.

The Gary, Ind., native was a three-time All-American at IU who led the Hoosiers’ unbeaten 1945 Big Ten Championship team in rushing. He’d go on to lead the program in rushing twice and passing once, and following the 1948 season he became the first African-American drafted by an NFL team when the Chicago Bears selected him in the 13th round.

Taliagerro would eventually spend seven years in the NFL, earning Pro Bowl honors three times. He totaled 2,255 rushing yards, 1,300 receiving yards, 1,633 passing yards and accounted for 37 touchdowns while playing for franchises in New York, Dallas, Baltimore and Philadelphia. He also became the only player in league history to play seven positions – running back, quarterback, wide receiver, cornerback, punter, punt returner and kickoff returner.

While those feats make him one of the most accomplished players in IU and Big Ten history, his contributions extended well beyond the collegiate and professional playing fields.

During the 1940s, Taliagerro and IU President Herman B Wells played a pivotal role in desegregating the IU campus and the City of Bloomington. During the era, Taliagerro was not allowed to eat at many local restaurants. When Wells found out that Taliagerro had to return home between classes because no nearby restaurants would serve him, Wells arranged for the two to have lunch at a nearby campus establishment. Wells and Taliagerro had lunch, and IU and the Bloomington community took a giant step toward desegregation.

Taliagerro’s contributions did not end at the conclusion of his playing career. A 1951 IU graduate who later earned a Master’s Degree from Howard University, Taliagerro returned to IU in 1972 and served as special assistant to IU President John Ryan. In that role and other roles on campus during the next two decades, he was a valuable and outspoken voice on social justice issues.

Taliagerro’s lifetime of accomplishments are chronicled on the statue, which is the work of Brian Hanlon, owner of Hanlon Studios. Hanlon has produced more than 300 works in both public and private collections, including the five granite monuments commemorating IU Basketball’s five national championships.





## TERRY TALLEN INDIANA FOOTBALL COMPLEX OPENS

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex officially opened on Aug. 13, 2019. Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass announced a major gift by alumnus and former IU Football captain Terry Tallen to the Indiana University Bicentennial Campaign for Athletics on April 20, 2018. This \$2 million commitment helped provide funding for the renovation of the football team area in Memorial Stadium. In recognition of his gift, the area will be permanently named the Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex.

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex fills 25,000+ square feet underneath the west stands of Memorial Stadium. The complex includes the Trent and Julie Green Locker Room (named in 2003), coaches' locker room, team lounge, recruiting area, equipment room and Dr. John M. Miller Training Room (named in 1994).

Tallen graduated from the Indiana University Kelley School of Business in 1982, and while earning his degree, was also a three-year letterman. Terry was elected team co-captain in 1979 and 1980. The 1979 team was nationally ranked and won the Holiday Bowl, the Hoosiers first bowl victory. Terry was named the United Press International's Defensive Player of the Week following Indiana's Homecoming victory over Wisconsin in 1980.

In 2001, Terry founded Tallen Capital Partners, LLC, and remains the company's Chairman and CEO. Tallen Capital Partners, LLC is a privately held, vertically integrated retail and mixed-use real estate investment and development organization with offices in San Diego and San Francisco. Prior to founding Tallen Capital Partners and becoming an entrepreneur, Terry enjoyed a corporate career as a senior executive with some of our country's largest public as well as private companies. He is considered one of the leading shopping center investors and developers in the Western U.S.

- Seventeen Indiana players have been drafted or invited to NFL camps over the past three seasons, including a school-record 11 in 2018.

**LEADING THE IU DEFENSE (2016-18)**

- Allen's defenses reached heights not seen in a generation in Bloomington.
- Continued to oversee the defense as head coach in 2017 and 2018, and his charges finished 2018 with 26 takeaways (T-11th nationally; T-2nd in the Big Ten), 13 fumble recoveries (T-5th; 2nd) and 13 interceptions (T-33rd; T-6th).

- During the 2016-17 campaigns, IU was the most improved team nationally in total defense (-169.4 ypg) and passing defense (-134.1 ypg), the sixth-most improved in third-down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ppg).
- The Hoosiers finished ninth nationally in third-down defense (29.9 percent – best program mark since 1992; 3rd in the Big Ten), 17th in passing defense (179.7 ypg – best program mark since 1995; 4th in the Big Ten) and 26th in total defense (340.1 ypg – best program mark since 1995) in 2017.
- Indiana ranked in the top six in the Big Ten in both total offense (6th) and total defense (6th) for the first time since 1991.

- South Florida posted an 8-5 record and earned a trip to the Miami Beach Bowl. Allen mentored three all-conference selections and the American Athletic Conference's top scoring defense (19.6 ppg in league play).
- In his lone season in Tampa, USF tied for 13th nationally in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), 14th in interceptions (17), 24th in takeaways (25) and 26th in sacks (2.62 per game), and was 31st in rushing defense (141.4 ypg), 34th in passing efficiency defense (118.76) and 35th in scoring defense (22.9 ppg).

**AT OLE MISS (2012-14)**

- Spent the 2012-14 campaigns as linebackers coach and special teams coordinator at Ole Miss, where he coached All-SEC linebackers Serderius Bryant and Denzel Nkemdiche.
- The Rebels closed out 2014 with a 9-4 record and ranked No. 9 after they met No. 6 TCU in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Ole Miss spent nine weeks in the AP Top 10 with a high-water mark of No. 3.
- Additionally, the Rebels led the nation in scoring defense (13.8 ppg) and allowed a national-low 18 touchdowns.
- Ole Miss topped the SEC in five categories and ranked in the Top 20 nationally in 11, including 10th in red zone defense, 11th in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), 12th in takeaways (28), 13th in total defense (321.2 ypg) and 13th in defensive touchdowns scored (4).
- Worked with defensive coordinator Dave Wommack to help guide a huge improvement in the Rebels defense, which ranked last in the SEC in total defense before their arrival in 2011. Under their stewardship, Ole Miss consistently ranked among the top teams in the SEC and nationally in tackles for loss and sacks.
- Nkemdiche earned Freshman All-America honors and second-team AP All-SEC after leading the Rebels in tackles (82), TFLs (13.0), forced fumbles (4) and interceptions (3) in 2012.



Indiana University's football program receives some of the most extensive media coverage in the country. Learfield IMG College holds the exclusive rights as IU's official radio outlet.



**DON FISCHER**

Don Fischer is in his 48th year as the "Radio Voice" of Indiana University football and basketball games. The past 34 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor, and is currently serving the IU Radio Network, owned by Learfield IMG College. In

addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches talk shows for both football and basketball.

Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

During his years of work in Indiana, Fischer has been named the state's Sportscaster of the Year 31 times by two different organizations. The National Sports Media Association has awarded him 27 times, including the recently announced 2019 award, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him their honoree four times.

In June of 2018 at the NSMA Awards program, Fischer was named the first recipient of the Woody Durham Voice of College Sports Award.

Fischer was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association Hall of Fame in 2004. He was inducted into the Indiana Broadcasters Association Hall of Fame in October 2010. Fischer has won several awards for best play by play, and has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non alumni for distinguished service to the University. This past year IU presented Fischer with the Bicentennial Medal in recognition of distinguished and distinctive service in support of the mission of Indiana University. He was also named an Honorary "I" Man in 1991.

Fischer has broadcast over 2,000 Indiana University games that include 11 bowl games, five NCAA basketball Final Fours, including four NCAA Championship games, and two NIT Championship games.

From 1973-87, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC, and several other major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that 14-year period, he also served Indianapolis radio station WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

As an independent contractor, Fischer served the Indianapolis Colts as their pre-season television anchor for 23 years from 1995-2017.

In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as a play-by-play broadcaster.

A native of Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 54 years with stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, Ill.; Springfield, Ill.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons, 12 grandchildren and one great grandchild. He and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



**BUCK SUHR**

Buck Suhr is entering his 16th season as the color commentator and analyst for Indiana University football.

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95)

as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory.

After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000-yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a then-school record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year.

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.

They have four grandchildren: Addy, Hayden, Taylor and Mack.



**JOE SMITH**

Joe Smith is in his 37th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983. Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in

Bloomington, is in his 51st year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAJK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Smith worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook.

- The win was the first over a Top-10 opponent for IU at Memorial Stadium since beating No. 3 Purdue (19-14) on Nov. 25, 1967.
- Indiana's last win over a ranked opponent came against No. 17 Michigan State in Bloomington, 24-21, in overtime on Oct. 1, 2016.
- IU has won 15 of the team's last 17 season openers and are 43-18 in Memorial Stadium openers.
- With the victory, Indiana improved to 5-7 in overtime games.

### OFFENSE

- Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** completed 19-of-36 passes for 170 yards and one touchdown. Penix also had a 1-yard rushing touchdown and ran in both the game-tying two-point conversion in regulation and the game-winning conversion in overtime.
- Junior running back **Stevie Scott III** carried the ball 20 times for 57 yards and two touchdowns. He is the 14th running back in Indiana football history to eclipse 2,000 career rushing yards and he owns 2,039 in his career.
- The Syracuse, N.Y., native moved into 10th on the all-time Hoosier list for total career touchdowns scored (24) and seventh in all-time rushing touchdowns (22).
- The 2019 second-team All-Big Ten selection has secured six multi-touchdown games in his career and Saturday marked his first since recording 26 carries for 116 yards and two scores in a 34-3 victory over Northwestern on Nov. 2, 2019.
- Senior wide receiver **Whop Philyor** totaled five catches for 36 yards and one touchdown for the Hoosiers.
- Senior wide receiver **Ty Fryfogle** hauled in two catches for 27 yards. His first reception of the contest put him over 1,000 career receiving yards, the 47th Hoosier to accomplish this feat.
- Redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Miles Marshall** matched a career-best with four receptions for 46 yards.
- True freshman wide receiver **Javon Swinton** had two receptions for 23 yards.
- Redshirt freshman left guard **Mike Katic** made his first-career start.

### DEFENSE

- Indiana secured three first-half takeaways, the first three-takeaway game since earning three against Northwestern on Nov. 2, 2019.
- The Hoosiers have recorded a takeaway in 30 of the last 32 games. IU cashed three turnovers into 17 first-half points.
- Junior linebacker **Micah McFadden** matched a career-high with 11 tackles, all a career-high solo. The game marked his second-career game with double-digit tackles after making 11 stops (10 solo) at Nebraska on Oct. 26, 2019. The Tampa, Fla., native added one TFL.
- Junior safety **Jamar Johnson** added a career-best 10 tackles, a career-high seven solos, and his fourth-career interception.
- The Sarasota, Fla., native has registered a pick in three-straight games dating back to the 2019 season. He also recorded his second-career forced fumble for his first-career multi-takeaway game.
- Junior safety **Devon Matthews** stuffed the stat sheet with eight tackles (5 solo), his first-career sack, one TFL and two pass breakups.

**TEAM**

- No. 17/19 Indiana (2-0, 2-0 Big Ten) defeated Rutgers (1-1, 1-1 Big Ten), 37-21, at SHI Stadium in Piscataway, N.J.
- The victory marks the first Hoosier win as a ranked team since a 24-17 triumph over Purdue on Nov. 20, 1993. IU was ranked No. 21 in the '93 Old Oaken Bucket game.
- Indiana has started 2-0 in each of the last three seasons under head coach Tom Allen and five of the last six seasons dating back to the 2015 campaign.
- The 2-0 start to Big Ten Conference play is the best start since defeating both Michigan State (31-0) and Northwestern (44-6) to open the 1991 conference slate.
- The victory gives Indiana its first Big Ten road-opening triumph since defeating Rutgers by a score of 24-17 in 2018.
- Indiana is 5-2 all-time against Rutgers, including 3-1 as the road team. The Hoosiers have topped the Scarlet Knights in four-consecutive matchups.
- For the sixth-straight season, IU has won its first contest away from Memorial Stadium, marking the longest such streak in program history.

**OFFENSE**

- The Indiana Hoosiers hit the 30-point threshold for the 11th time since the beginning of the 2019 season and the second time in as many outings to start the '20 campaign. The 11 such games rank second in the Big Ten Conference, trailing only Ohio State (13).
- Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** completed 17-of-26 passes for 238 yards and three touchdowns, matching a career-best scoring output.
- Penix Jr. added 20 yards rushing, including a career-long rush of 25 yards, on six carries, and his second touchdown in as many weeks. Penix has four career rushing scores.
- Junior running back **Stevie Scott III** toted 21 carries for a season-high 81 yards. Scott has strung together 10-straight games with at least 50 rushing yards, a streak that began on Sept. 21, 2019, with 97 yards and a touchdown in the IU victory over UConn.
- The 81-yard effort by the Syracuse, N.Y., native was his highest rushing yardage total since securing 116 yards and two touchdowns on 26 carries against Northwestern on Nov. 2, 2019.
- Senior wide receiver **Whop Philyor** hauled in five receptions for a game-high 137 yards. He has amassed 136 career receptions, sliding him into the 10th spot on the program's all-time receptions leaderboard.
- The Plant, Fla., product is tied for fourth in program history with seven 100-yard games. Philyor had a long reception of 63 yards in the win, his third career 50-plus yard reception.
- Redshirt junior tight end **Peyton Hendershot** hauled in six catches for 34 yards and his seventh and eighth-career touchdowns. His eight career touchdowns rank second in program history among tight ends, trailing only Ted Bolser (2010-13) who had 15 career touchdowns.
- The game marked the first multi-TD game for Hendershot.
- The All-Big Ten third-team selection becomes the fourth tight end in program history to accumulate 75-plus career catches (75) and 800-plus career receiving yards (832).
- Senior wide receiver **Ty Fryfogle** racked up four receptions for 55 yards, including a 15-yard score, his first touchdown of the 2020 campaign. The scoring grab marked his seventh career score.

**DEFENSE**

- The Hoosiers have recorded a takeaway in 31 of the last 33 games. IU has created six takeaways during the 2020 season and have scored 27 points off of them.
- The Indiana defense has at least two interceptions in three-straight games dating back to the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl against Tennessee. The three interceptions mark the most by a Hoosier defense since picking off three passes at Florida International on Sept. 1, 2016.
- Sophomore cornerback **Tiawan Mullen** had seven total tackles and led the team in tackles for loss (2.5) and sacks (2.5). Mullen had entered the game without a sack in his career.
- Junior safety **Jamar Johnson** racked up six tackles (4 solos). The reigning Big Ten Conference co-Defensive Player of the Week added 1.5 TFLs.
- Junior linebacker **Micah McFadden** notched five tackles (1 solo) to go along with 0.5 TFLs. He also grabbed in his first interception of the 2020 season, the third of his career, and a QB hurry.
- Junior safety **Devon Matthews** locked up six total tackles (4 solos) and a pass breakup.
- Graduate transfer defensive tackle **Jovan Swann** made his Indiana Hoosier starting debut in the contest. Swann has started 20 games in his career with 19 coming at Stanford. He made two tackles (1 solo).
- Junior cornerback **Jaylin Williams** notched three solo tackles, one TFL, one QB hurry and one interception. The pick marks the fourth of his career and the second in as many weeks to open the 2020 season.
- Junior linebacker **Cam Jones** chipped in three total tackles (2 solos), one TFL, one sack, the third of his career, one QB hurry and one pass breakup.
- Junior cornerback **Reese Taylor** totaled eight tackles (7 solos), one TFL, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.

- Indiana has started 3-0 for the second time under head coach Tom Allen (2018).
- For the first time in program history, Indiana has defeated both Penn State and Michigan in the same season.
- Prior to today, Indiana's last win over Michigan came on Oct. 24, 1987, with the No. 14 Hoosiers beating the No. 20 Wolverines, 14-10.

**OFFENSE**

- The Indiana Hoosiers hit the 30-point threshold for the 12th time since the beginning of the 2019 season, the second-most such games in the Big Ten. Ohio State leads the conference with 15 30-point games.
- Indiana went on a 12-play, 96-yard touchdown drive that chewed up 4:21 seconds of game time right before the halftime break. The drive marked the longest scoring drive in yardage this season, second in both plays and time.
- In total, the Hoosiers recorded four scoring drives of 10-plus plays in the win. Entering the game, IU had totaled just one such drive this season.
- The Hoosier offense have had 16 red zone drives this season and converted all 16 drives into points. Of the 16 scoring drives, 12 have resulted in touchdowns, including 4-for-4 against the Wolverines.
- Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** completed 30-of-50 passes for a career-high 342 yards and career-high-tying three passing scores. His 50 attempts were also a career-best.
- The Tampa native has now tossed multiple touchdowns in consecutive games (6 in the last two weeks combined). He has had multiple-touchdown throws in five career games.
- Penix's 342 passing yards are the second-most for a Hoosier passer against Michigan (Ben Chappell 480 yards on Oct. 2, 2010).
- Senior wide receiver **Ty Fryfogle** turned in a career day with new personal-bests in receptions (7) and yards (142) to go along with his second touchdown in as many weeks.
- The 1,000-yard career receiver has compiled two career 100-yard games (131 at PSU, Nov. 16, 2019) and eight career scores.
- Senior wide receiver **Whop Philyor** led all receivers with 11 catches for 79 yards. With his 11 grabs Philyor moved in to seventh place on the Indiana career list with 147.
- The Tampa Plant product last pulled in double-digit catches against Nebraska (Oct. 26, 2019) with a 14-catch, 178-yard performance. He extends his own school record with seven career double-figure catch games.
- Junior running back **Stevie Scott III** tallied 24 rushing attempts for 97 yards and a pair of scores. He now owns 24 rushing touchdowns (7th all time) and 26 total scores, eighth in program history.
- The Syracuse, N.Y., native has amassed seven career multi-touchdown games, including two this season. He also matched a season-best with three catches for 13 yards.
- Redshirt junior tight end **Peyton Hendershot** hauled in four passes for 31 yards and a touchdown. The score gives him three touchdowns in the last two games and nine for his career, the second most by a tight end in program history (Ted Bolser 15).

**DEFENSE**

- The Hoosiers recorded a pair of interceptions in the fourth quarter and have recorded a takeaway in 32 of the last 34 games. IU has created eight takeaways during the 2020 season and have scored 34 points off turnovers.
- Indiana has seven total INTs in 2020 and has picked off at least two balls in four-straight games.
- The Hoosier defense held Michigan to just 13 yards rushing, believed to be the lowest yardage output by a Wolverine rushing attack against IU. The 13 rushing yards surrendered was the lowest by an IU opponent since William & Mary charted -32 yards on Aug. 31, 2002 and the fewest by a Big Ten opponent since Purdue tallied -8 yards on Nov. 24, 2001.
- Junior cornerback **Reese Taylor** had a team-high seven tackles, all solo, with a career-high two TFLs and his first career sack.
- Junior cornerback **Jaylin Williams** intercepted a pass for the third-straight game and returned it 36 yards. Williams also had a tackle in the win.
- Junior safety **Devon Matthews** totaled five tackles, all solo, with his second career interception, a TFL and a pass breakup.
- Sophomore linebacker **D.K. Bonhomme** recorded his first career sack and finished the game with two tackles and a TFL.
- Junior defensive lineman **James Head Jr.** had a sack in the win, pushing his season total to 1.5 and his career mark to 4.0.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

- Redshirt sophomore kicker **Charles Campbell** hit a career-long 52-yard field goal, which is tied for the sixth-longest field goal made in program history.
- Campbell is 6-for-6 on field goals this season and 8-for-8 in his career. Campbell also connected on all five of his PATs in the game, pushing his season total to 11-for-11 and his career mark to 12-for-12.
- Graduate student punter **Haydon Whitehead** booted five punts for 231 yards (46.2 per punt), including a season-best effort of 54 yards.
- Sophomore long snapper **Sean Wracher** has snapped in all 16 career games played at Indiana.

**POST-GAME NOTES**

**TEAM**

- No. 10/10 Indiana (4-0, 4-0 Big Ten) took down Michigan State (1-3, 1-3 Big Ten), 24-0, at Spartan Stadium in East Lansing, Mich., to claim the Old Brass Spittoon for the first time since 2016. The victory marks the first for the Hoosiers in East Lansing since 2001.
- The 24-point victory is the largest margin of victory for Indiana at Michigan State in the history of the rivalry, besting the previous mark of 16 (16-0) set in 1969.
- Indiana secures its first victory as a Top-10 team since knocking off Michigan State by a score of 14-13 as the No. 6 team in the country on Nov. 11, 1967.
- The 4-0 start to Big Ten play is the best start since 1987 (4-0) and tied for the second-best ever (1967, 5-0). For the first time since the 1993 season, Indiana has won its first two road conference games.
- IU is 12-5 since the start of the 2019 season and 9-4 in Big Ten play during that time.
- Indiana has won five-straight Big Ten conference games, tied for the longest streak in program history (1967), and 9-of-11 dating back to the 2019 season. This marks the most successful stretch of conference games since a 9-2 conference record from Oct. 3, 1987-Oct. 21, 1988.
- Indiana is 4-0 for the first time under head coach **Tom Allen**. It is tied for the third-best start in program history. The Hoosiers also started 4-0 or better in: 2015, 1990, 1986, 1985, 1967 (8-0) and 1910 (5-0).
- The program has earned victories in each of the last three road games against Big Ten Conference opponents for the first time since the 1982 season. The '82 team was coached by ESPN College GameDay analyst Lee Corso.
- For the first time in program history, IU has defeated Penn State, Michigan and Michigan State in the same season. The Hoosiers last downed Michigan and Michigan State in the same campaign in 1967.
- Indiana is currently in possession of both of its rivalry trophies, the Old Brass Spittoon and the Old Oaken Bucket (Purdue).

**OFFENSE**

- Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** completed 25-of-38 passes for 320 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. He has completed 20-plus passes in consecutive games for the first time this season and the second time in his career (Sept. 28 and Oct. 12, 2019).
- Penix now owns three 300-yard passing games and has tallied consecutive 300-yard passing games for the first time in his career and for the first time since Nate Sudfeld closed out his career with three-straight 300-yard games in 2015.
- The Tampa, Fla., native has racked up 58 completions on 80 attempts for 606 yards and two touchdowns in a pair of starts against Michigan State at Spartan Stadium.
- The game marked the 10th-career start in the Cream & Crimson for Penix. He holds a record of 9-1 as a starter.
- Senior wide receiver **Ty Fryfogle** turned in his second-straight career game, recording personal-bests in receptions (11), yards (200) and touchdowns (2), his ninth and 10th-career scoring grabs. The 6-2, 214-pounder has caught at least one touchdown in three-straight contests.
- Fryfogle's 178 first-half receiving yards marked the most by a Big Ten player since 2010 when Roy Roundtree (Michigan) registered four catches for 192 yards and two touchdowns in the first half against Illinois.
- His 65-yard touchdown grab in the second quarter marked a career-long catch and the longest TD grab by a Hoosier since current Tennessee Titan Nick Westbrook hauled in a 75-yarder against Ball State to open the 2019 season.
- Fryfogle has now logged consecutive 100-yard receiving games for the first time in his career and is the first Hoosier to do so since Whop Philyor on Sept. 28 and Oct. 12, 2019. The Lucedale, Miss., native has recorded three-career 100-yard receiving games, all against Big Ten opponents.
- He is the seventh receiver in program history to snag 200-plus yards receiving in a single game and the first since Ricky Jones posted 208 yards against Wake Forest on Sept. 24, 2006.
- Junior running back **Stevie Scott III** tallied 23 carries for 84 yards and a score, his 25th career rushing touchdown. He has scored at least one touchdown in 15 of his last 20 games played.
- He ranks eighth in program history in career carries (494), eighth in career total touchdowns (27), and just outside of the Top 10 in career rushing yards (2,301).
- Senior wide receiver **Whop Philyor** became the sixth pass-catcher in program history to secure 150 career catches, the first since Shane Wynn in 2014, with his third catch in the first half. He finished the game with three catches for 35 yards.
- Redshirt junior tight end **Peyton Hendershot** brought down two catches for 11 yards to become the fourth tight end in program history to reach 80 career catches (81). His 81 career catches are tied with Dave Lilja for the third-most in program history by a tight end.

**DEFENSE**

- The Hoosiers added four more takeaways in the game and now have recorded a takeaway in 33 of the last 35 games. IU has created 12 takeaways through four games in the 2020 season and have scored 51 points off of the turnovers.
- The defense has reeled off six-straight games with a least two takeaways dating back to the end of the 2019 regular season.
- Indiana has 10 total INTs in 2020 and have picked off at least two passes in five-straight games. The Hoosiers have also charted at least one interception in seven-consecutive contests.
- The four takeaways compiled by the Hoosier defense marks the most since securing three fumble recoveries and one interception in a 34-32 victory over Maryland on Nov. 10, 2018.
- Michigan State did not cross the Indiana 35-yard line, with its best field position coming at the IU 38. The Hoosiers held the Spartans to just 191 yards (60 rushing, 131 passing).
- Sophomore cornerback **Tiawan Mullen** recorded a pair of interceptions, the first two of his short career and the first multi-takeaway game of his career. The Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native is the first Hoosier since Jonathan Crawford (Nov. 26, 2016) to record a pair of INTs in a game.
- Junior linebacker **Micah McFadden** racked up a team-best nine tackles (5 solos), a career-high three TFLs, and a career-best two sacks. He now owns three multi-TFL games in his career.
- Fifth-year defensive lineman **Jerome Johnson** recorded four tackles (3 solos), a career-best-tying 2.5 TFLs, and a career-best 2.0 sacks, his third-career game with multiple sacks, in his 25th career start. He now owns 11.5 career sacks, the highest total of any active Hoosier.
- Junior cornerback **Reese Taylor** stuffed the box score with two solo tackles, one TFL, one PBU, one forced fumble and his second career interception. The Ben Davis product returned it 53 yards, a career long. He also returned one punt for 18 yards.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

- Redshirt sophomore kicker **Charles Campbell** hit a 21-yard field goal and all three of his PAT tries for a total of six points. He later missed a 41-yard field goal, his first miss in 10 career attempts. Campbell has converted 7-of-8 field goal attempts this season and is 14-of-14 on extra points in 2020.
- Graduate student punter **Haydon Whitehead** punted three times for 119 yards in the game for an average of 39.7 yards. He charted a long kick of 42 yards and knocked one punt inside the 20-yard line.

- No. 9/10 Indiana (4-1, 4-1 Big Ten) fell to No. 3/3 Ohio State (4-0, 4-0 Big Ten), 42-35, at Ohio Stadium in Columbus, Ohio.
- IU is 12-6 since the start of the 2019 season and 9-5 in Big Ten play during that time.

**OFFENSE**

- The Hoosiers hit the 30-point threshold for the 13th time since the beginning of the 2019 season, tied for the second-most such games in the Big Ten. Ohio State leads the conference with 16 30-point games.
- Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** tallied 27 completions on 51 attempts for a career-high 491 yards (2nd in program history), his third-straight 300-yard passing day. The lefty also tossed a career-best five touchdowns (T-3rd in program history) and one interception.
- His 491 passing yards against the Buckeyes ranks as the second-highest single-game passing output in program history, and the most ever against Ohio State. It is the highest total yardage output against Ohio State at Ohio Stadium since 1985 (Jim Everett, 497) and the fourth-highest figure put up vs. OSU.
- Penix is the fourth quarterback to throw at least five touchdowns against the Buckeyes and the first since Iowa's Nate Stanley tossed five scores on Nov. 14, 2017.
- He is the first Indiana QB to tally three-straight 300-yard passing games since Nate Sudfeld closed out the 2015 campaign with three-straight games with at least 300 yards.
- Senior wide receiver **Ty Fryfogle** compiled a third-straight massive game with seven catches for 218 yards (5th in program history) and three scores (T-2nd in program history). He is the first Big Ten player to record back-to-back 200-yard receiving games.
- The reigning Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week has strung together three-straight 100-yard receiving games, the first Hoosier to do so since former second-round draft pick Cody Latimer had 100-plus yards against Bowling Green (137), Missouri (136) and Penn State (140) in 2013.
- He has totaled seven receiving touchdowns in the last four games, the most in a four-game stretch for the Hoosiers since James Hardy pulled in eight scoring grabs from Oct.-Nov. 2006.
- Fryfogle has caught at least one touchdown in four-straight games and has racked up 25 catches for 560 yards and six touchdowns combined in the last three weeks.
- The Lucedale, Miss., native's yardage total was the third-highest ever put up against Ohio State. He trails only Sammy Watkins (227) and Chris Moore (221).
- Sophomore running back **David Ellis** totaled a season-high four receptions for a career-best 86 yards and his first-career receiving touchdown. He also hauled in a career long 51-yard reception.
- Redshirt junior wide receiver **Miles Marshall** made four catches to match his career-best with a career-high 89 yards, including a career-long catch of 68 yards to setup Indiana's first touchdown.
- Senior wide receiver **Whop Philyor** added six catches for 56 yards and his second touchdown of the season. His 156 career receptions moved him past Tandon Doss (154) for fifth on the all-time career receptions list.
- Redshirt junior tight end **Peyton Hendershot** moved into sole possession of third on Indiana's all-time receptions list among tight ends (85 career catches) with four catches for 32 yards.
- Junior running back **Stevie Scott III** moved into the Top 10 in career rushing yards at Indiana with 2,307 yards. He surpassed Stephen Houston (2011-13) for 10th in the record book.
- Scott compiled 29 yards of total offense (6 rushing, 23 receiving) on nine total touches.

- The Hoosiers secured three more takeaways in the game and now have recorded a takeaway in 34 of the last 36 games. IU has created 15 takeaways through five games in the 2020 season and have scored 51 points off of the turnovers.

- Indiana has 13 total INTs in 2020 and have picked off at least two passes in six-straight games. The Hoosiers have tallied at least one interception in eight-straight games.
- Indiana now has multiple interceptions in all five games this season, the most nationally. IU is the first Big Ten team since 2009 (Ohio State) to record multiple interceptions in at least five-straight games in a single season.
- The defense had three interceptions for the third time in as many tries on the road this season. The Hoosiers also nabbed a trio of picks at Rutgers (Oct. 31) and at Michigan State (Nov. 14).
- Junior linebacker **Micah McFadden** paced the Hoosiers with 10 total tackles (10 solos) and one TFL. The game marks his third-career double-digit tackling effort and his second of the season.
- Junior safety **Jamar Johnson** had a big game for the defense, securing five solo tackles, one sack, one TFL, one PBU and a pair of interceptions.

- The Hoosiers 5-1 record is their best overall start since 2007 and their best conference start since 1987 (5-1).
- IU is 13-6 overall and 10-5 in league play since the start of the 2019 campaign.
- Indiana clinched a winning Big Ten record in consecutive seasons for first time since 1987-88 and for the sixth time overall (1967-68, 1944-46 and 1936-37).
- The Hoosiers five B1G victories are tied for the third-most in school history (2019, 1993, 1991, 1988, 1979, 1945) behind six-win campaigns in 1967 (6-1) and 1987 (6-2).

**DEFENSE**

- The Hoosiers secured three more takeaways in the game and now have recorded a takeaway in 35 of the last 37 games.

- IU is 14-6 since the start of the 2019 season and 11-5 in Big Ten play during that time.
- Indiana has won 11-of-14 Big Ten games, the best stretch in program history.
- The Hoosiers six B1G victories are tied for the most in school history, matching the marks set in 1967 (6-1) and 1987 (6-2).
- Indiana's 11 B1G victories are tied for the most in program history in a two-year span (1987-88).
- IU has secured three victories against Top-25 teams this season, tying the program record (1945) after winning home games against No. 8/7 Penn State (36-35 OT) and No. 23/25 Michigan (38-21).

# 1968 ROSE BOWL



**JANUARY 1, 1968**

**SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA 14, INDIANA 3**

On Nov. 25, 1967, Indiana University improved its record to 9-1 with a 19-14 upset win over Purdue in the regular-season finale. The win clinched the Big Ten title and secured the Hoosiers' initial postseason bid - a trip to the Rose Bowl and a tilt against top-ranked and O.J. Simpson-led Southern California. Remarkably, just one season earlier in 1966, Indiana had finished the season with a 1-8-1 record.

IU's only Rose Bowl appearance would not be an easy task for the Hoosiers. However, 102,946 fans watched intently as Indiana would give the Trojans everything they could handle for four quarters.

USC tallied first when All-America running back Simpson (25-128-2TDs rushing) scored on a 2-yard touchdown run in the first quarter to cap an 84-yard scoring drive. Indiana would answer just one quarter later. The Hoosiers had a first-and-goal inside the Southern California 10-yard line but could not score a touchdown. However, Indiana kicker David Kornowa did connect on a 27-yard field goal attempt that pulled the Hoosiers to within 7-3, a lead that USC would take into the locker room at halftime.

In the third quarter, the Trojans put together their final scoring drive of the day. This time it was a 45-yard drive capped by an eight-yard touchdown run by Simpson. The "Cardiac Kids," a nickname that IU had been given because of several exciting comebacks throughout the 1967 campaign, would threaten one more time but could not close the gap. IU moved to the USC 37-yard line midway through the fourth stanza but failed on two chances to gain a first down with just inches to go.

# 1979 HOLIDAY BOWL


**DECEMBER 21, 1979**  
**SAN DIEGO, CALIF.**  
**INDIANA 38, BRIGHAM YOUNG 37**

Many people described it as the most exciting game of the 1979 bowl season. The 1979 Holiday Bowl featured Indiana and Brigham Young. The two squads would combine to score 75 total points in addition to tallying 52 first downs and 874 yards of total offense. However, after eight lead changes, Indiana stood victorious, 38-37, over the previously unbeaten Cougars.

Having finished the 1979 regular season with a 7-4 record, Indiana looked to gain its initial bowl victory when it faced off against the Cougars. It was a tight battle throughout as Brigham Young quarterback Marc Wilson completed 28-of-43 passes for 380 yards and 2 TDs. Throughout the game, he showed many reasons why he led the nation in passing and total offense during the regular season. However, IU found a way to answer every BYU score.

The Cougars would take a 24-21 lead early in the third quarter, but IU tallied right back when running back Mike Harkrader (24-71-1TD rushing) scored on a 1-yard touchdown run to give the Hoosiers a 28-24 lead. Indiana kicker Kevin Kellogg would then connect on a 26-yard field goal to increase the IU lead to 31-24. However, a 29-yard field goal by BYU and a 15-yard touchdown strike from Wilson to fullback Eric Lane, put the Cougars in front, 34-31, at the end of three quarters.

The fourth quarter did not lack for theatrics. BYU would score the quarter's first points to increase its lead to 37-31. However, Indiana's Tim Wilbur countered with a 62-yard punt return to tie the game at 37-37. Kellogg would add the extra point to give IU a one-point advantage with 6:53 remaining in the contest. Brigham Young had the opportunity to win the contest on a field goal attempt with just 11 seconds remaining. However, a 27-yard effort by Cougar kicker Brent Johnson failed, and IU held on for the thrilling 38-37 victory.

Although he finished with an 0-11 record during his first campaign at Indiana in 1984, it would take Bill Mallory just three seasons to lead the Hoosiers to their first bowl appearance under his direction. Indiana finished with a 6-5 regular-season record in 1986 and capped its season by playing a talented Florida State team in the 1986 All-American Bowl on New Year's Eve in Birmingham, Ala.


Despite losing 27-13, the Hoosiers would go on to make bowl appearances following four of the next five seasons.

Florida State used four time-consuming scoring drives that averaged 66 yards each to capture the 10th annual All-American Bowl. IU penetrated inside the Seminole 35-yard line four times without a score.

Indiana would tally first as Pete Stoyanovich connected on a 35-yard field goal to give the Hoosiers a 3-0 lead. However, Florida State running back Sammie Smith (25-205-2TDs) scored on runs of four and nine yards in the first and second quarters, respectively, to give the Seminoles a 13-3 halftime lead.

The Seminoles would score another touchdown during the third quarter that would essentially clinch the victory. IU did close the gap to within 20-13 in the fourth quarter, but FSU iced the game with a 68-yard scoring drive.

Indiana running back Anthony Thompson, who was playing in his first bowl game, finished with 127 rushing yards on 28 carries and quarterback Dave Kramme threw for 168 yards. IU dominated the time of possession and totaled more first downs (23-20) and total yards (383-342) than Florida State. However, the Seminoles rushed for 288 yards and were forced into third-down situations on just three occasions during the entire game.




Tennessee drove 40 yards in nine plays and scored on a 9-yard touchdown run by running back Reggie Cobb with just 1:52 remaining in the game to clinch a 27-22 victory over Indiana in the 20th Peach Bowl. The game, which was played on Jan. 2, 1988, at Atlanta's Fulton County Stadium, was witnessed by 58,737 fans. Despite the disappointing loss, IU finished the season with an 8-4 record, which included wins over Michigan and Ohio State.

The Volunteers jumped to a quick 21-3 second-quarter lead. That same stanza, UT blocked an Indiana punt on the IU 9-yard line that gave the Volunteers an opportunity to put the game out of reach. However, IU forced a fumble and drove 91 yards for a touchdown, a 43-yard pass play from quarterback Dave Schnell (33-18-218-1TD-2INTs) to wide receiver Ernie Jones (7-150-1TD). The score narrowed IU's deficit to 21-10 prior to halftime.

The lone score of the third period was a 12-yard run by running back Anthony Thompson (18-67-1TD) that moved Indiana to within 21-16, however, the two-point conversion failed. In the fourth quarter, Indiana scored on a fake field goal attempt when tight end Tim Jordan ran 12 yards for a score that gave IU a one-point lead, 22-21. The two-point conversion attempt was unsuccessful. Tennessee, which had come from behind on four other occasions during the 1987 campaign would turn the trick again as Cobb scored his second touchdown of the game, this one a 9-yard run, to give Tennessee the 27-22 victory.

Tennessee gained 474 yards of total offense, including 146 rushing yards and two touchdowns from Cobb, the game's Most Valuable Offensive Player. However, Jones was just as impressive, as he finished with 246 all-purpose yards (150 receiving, 15 rushing, 81 kickoff returns). Indiana linebacker Van Waiters was recognized as the game's Most Valuable Defensive Player.



After finishing the regular season with a 7-3-1 record and a 5-3 mark in the Big Ten, Indiana earned a postseason berth for the third consecutive year and played South Carolina in the Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tenn. The Hoosiers dominated the game and cruised to a 34-10 victory before 39,210 fans.

Indiana running back Anthony Thompson (26-140-2TDs) began the scoring with a 7-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, and the Hoosiers would add 10 more second-quarter points to take a 17-0 halftime lead. The Gamecocks would close the gap to 17-7 in the third quarter when they scored on a 34-yard return of a blocked punt. The two teams would then trade third-quarter field goals and the fourth quarter began with Indiana leading, 20-10.

Although Indiana dominated throughout, the game-breaking play occurred on the first snap of the fourth quarter when Indiana quarterback Dave Schnell (31-16-378-2TDs-1INT) hooked up with wide receiver Rob Turner (5-182-1TD) on an 88-yard touchdown pass that upped IU's lead to 27-10. Thompson would cap the scoring with an 8-yard touchdown run later that quarter that earned him a tie for the Big Ten single-season touchdown record with 26 scores.

Indiana set a Liberty Bowl record with 575 yards of total offense. South Carolina, on the other hand, could muster only 153 total yards, including just 23 yards rushing. The IU defense intercepted three passes and recovered a fumble to go along with six quarterback sacks.

Schnell was the game's Most Valuable Player, and wide receiver Tony Buford caught three passes for 100 yards.




Indiana finished with a 6-4-1 regular-season record in 1990, a mark good enough to earn the Hoosiers a berth in the Peach Bowl for a date with the Auburn Tigers. The game, which was played at Fulton County Stadium in Atlanta on Dec. 30, 1990, was one of the best games played during the 1990 bowl season.

Auburn led Indiana 17-10 at halftime and increased its lead to 20-10 on a 43-yard field goal during the third quarter, but the Hoosiers returned the favor as quarterback Trent Green scored on touchdown runs of two and 11 yards to give IU a 23-20 lead.

However, Auburn quarterback Stan White (48-31-351-1TD passing and 2 TD runs) would direct the Tigers on a 13-play, 72-yard, 1:40-minute, scoring drive. He capped the drive himself when he scored on a 1-yard run with just 39 seconds remaining in the game. The touchdown gave Auburn a 27-23 victory.

Auburn dominated the game statistically, as the Tigers tallied 440 total yards to IU's 220. However, Indiana utilized a solid kicking game to keep the game close. Trent Green tied a Peach Bowl record with his three rushing touchdowns while running back Vaughn Dunbar (21-81) and free safety Mike Dumas (14 tackles, 4 passes broken up) earned offensive and defensive Most Valuable Player honors, respectively.



In one of the most impressive performances by any team during the 1991 bowl season, Indiana dominated a highly-regarded Baylor team in the Copper Bowl, 24-0.

Indiana wasted little time getting started as it jumped to a 17-0 halftime lead and was never threatened on its way to winning its second bowl game in four years.

Indiana quarterback Trent Green (21-11-165-0-0 passing, 2 rushing touchdowns) broke the Hoosiers into the scoring column when he tallied a 1-yard touchdown run in the first quarter. IU would increase its lead one quarter later when kicker Scott Bonnell connected on a 27-yard field goal attempt and running back Vaughn Dunbar (28-106-1TD rushing) scored on a 5-yard touchdown run to give the Hoosiers a 17-0 halftime advantage.

IU's only scary moment came in the third quarter when Baylor reached Indiana's 2-yard line. However, a muffed handoff resulted in a fumble that was recovered in the end zone by free safety Damon Watts and the game was, for all intents and purposes, over.

Dunbar won game Most Valuable Player honors on offense and linebacker Mark Hagen (11 tackles, including 2 tackles for loss, and 1 pass broken up) was the game's defensive MVP.




Virginia Tech used two touchdowns in the final 23 seconds of the first half to post a 45-20 victory over Indiana in the 1993 Independence Bowl.

On the positive side of the ledger for IU, wide receiver Thomas Lewis tallied six receptions for 177 yards and two touch-downs. However, Virginia Tech quarterback Maurice DeShazo completed 19-of-33 passes for 193 yards and two touchdowns on his way to earning offensive game MVP honors.

On the other side of the ball, safety Antonio Banks was the game's defensive MVP as he tallied nine tackles, one interception and one pass broken up, in addition to a touchdown on the blocked field goal.

Indiana finished the 1993 season with an 8-4 record. Two of its three regular season losses were by seven points or less.


Indiana capped off an emotional season in achieving late head coach Terry Hooppner's dream of "Playing 13," as the Hoosiers returned to a postseason bowl for the first time in 14 years at the 2007 Insight Bowl.

Oklahoma State's no-huddle offense took a strong first half lead, and it was too much for a spirited Hoosier squad to overcome in a 49-33 defeat. The Hoosiers rallied from a 35-10 halftime deficit to get within two scores on two separate occasions in the second half.

Kellen Lewis threw for 204 yards and a pair of touchdowns in the loss, tying IU great Antwaan Randle El for first place on the all-time list with 42 TD passes in his career. The sophomore quarterback also ran for 83 yards on 10 carries and scored a touchdown on the ground.

The Hoosiers drove 52 yards on 11 plays on their opening drive, taking a 3-0 lead on Austin Starr's 43-yard field goal at the 10:41 mark of the opening quarter. But OSU scored the next 28 points of the game before the Hoosiers made it 28-10 on a Marcus Thigpen 4-yard TD grab. Cowboy quarterback Zac Robinson tacked on a 1-yard run just before the half to give OSU a 25-point lead at the break.

IU struck with the first points of the second half on a Lewis 1-yard run that followed a 4th-and-8 conversion on a fake field goal pass from Lewis to Starr. The Cowboys rebutted with a TD of their own, and 16 fourth quarter points by the Hoosiers proved to not be enough to overcome the early deficit.

# 2015 PINSTRIPE BOWL

Duke kicker Ross Martin kicked a 36-yard field goal in overtime that Indiana wasn't able to match to give the Blue Devils a 44-41 victory in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium.

The back-and-forth game featured nine lead changes and three ties. It also saw numerous offensive records set and six turnovers combined in a game where momentum seemed to be hanging in the balance throughout.

Duke quarterback Thomas Sirk scored on a 5-yard touchdown run up the middle with just 41 seconds to play in regulation to tie the game at 41-41. The Hoosiers drove down the field in the little time they had left, setting Griffin Oakes up for a 56-yard field goal try that missed wide left at the end of regulation.

Indiana found its scoring gear midway through the second quarter and didn't slow down the rest of the game behind a career-best day by sophomore back Devine Redding, who finished with 227 yards on 35 carries.

The Hoosiers' problem was that the Blue Devils kept up, trading scores and never allowing one team to hold momentum long enough to make a game-winning stand. Sirk accounted for the majority of the damage, passing for 163 yards and a touchdown and adding another two scores and 155 yards on the ground.



Duke scored 10 unanswered points to begin the game, but after the Hoosiers responded with their first touchdown midway through the second quarter, neither team would ever lead by more than one possession.

In the Indiana locker room, head coach Kevin Wilson told his players not to dwell over one play, one call or anything particular in the loss.

He wanted to see their eyes.

He wanted to tell them to keep their heads up and stay confident.

And he already wanted them to move on.

# 2016 FOSTER FARMS BOWL

The Indiana football team fell on a late field goal to No. 19 Utah, 26-24, in the Foster Farms Bowl.

Indiana took a 24-23 lead in the fourth quarter on a 3-yard touchdown run from Devine Redding, but the Utes connected on the field goal with just 1:24 left in the game.

Appearing in consecutive bowls for the first time since 1990-91 and for the fourth time in program history, IU posted back-to-back six-win seasons for the first time since 1993-94.

Defensively, Indiana was led by Tegray Scales, who was named the Foster Farms Bowl Defensive MVP after totaling a team-high 10 tackles to go with two sacks and three tackles for loss.

The Hoosiers started the game with a bang, as Greg Gooch forced a fumble on the opening kickoff to set IU up deep in Utah territory. Just 52 seconds into the game, quarterback Richard Lagow connected with wide receiver Mitchell Paige for a 7-yard touchdown to give Indiana a 7-0 lead with the fastest score in Foster Farms Bowl history.

Utah answered back with 17 unanswered points, taking a 17-7 lead, but the Hoosiers dominated the final minutes of the second quarter. After a Griffin Oakes 24-yard field goal, the IU defense forced its second straight three-and-out to give the offense the ball back.



On the ensuing drive, wide receiver Nick Westbrook hauled in a 36-yard score with 1:38 remaining in the half, tying the game at 17-17.

In the third quarter, the Utes hit a pair of field goals to take a six-point lead, 23-17, into the fourth quarter. The Hoosiers defense again came up huge when it mattered most, forcing a Utah fumble to set up the offense at its own 40-yard line.

IU marched down the field with an 11-play, 60-yard drive that finished with Redding's 3-yard score to give Indiana a 24-23 lead with 10:10 left.

The Hoosiers reached the Utah 47-yard line with five seconds remaining, but a desperation heave from Lagow was tipped at the line.

Defensively, Indiana had a season-high four takeaways along with a season-best five sacks.

Victory was there. History was within reach. Just take it.

Everything that Indiana wanted for its football program -- the first bowl victory since 1991, a nine-win season -- was there Thursday night in Jacksonville, Fla. And then it wasn't.

The final TaxSlayer Gator Bowl score -- Tennessee 23, Indiana 22.

The Volunteers (8-5) scored 14 points in 31 seconds late in the fourth quarter, nine in the other 59 minutes and 29 seconds. It was enough for their sixth-straight victory.

Peyton Ramsey rushed 17 times for 54 yards and a touchdown. He completed 20-of-34 passes for 227 yards.

Tight end Peyton Hendershot caught six passes for 67 yards despite a banged-up shoulder. Nick Westbrook caught four for 48.

A young defense made plays -- highlighted by husky Jamar Johnson's 63-yard pick-6.

For most of the first half, IU had no offense. Ramsey was under constant pressure, and the running game was ineffective. Fortunately for the Hoosiers, the defense was in major bend-don't-break mode.

Finally, it broke through with linebacker Micah McFadden's interception, the result of fierce defensive pressure.

That gave the Hoosiers the ball in Tennessee territory, and Ramsey went to work. He converted a fourth-and-one quarterback sneak, then ran the Hoosiers inside the 10-yard line as the clock ticked under 10 seconds. That set up Logan Justus' 24-yard field goal.


In a half dominated by Tennessee (a 202-to-69 total yard edge), IU trailed just 6-3.

The Hoosiers had the ball to start the second half for the first 5:31. Ramsey converted another quarterback sneak for a touchdown and a 10-6 Hoosier lead.

Tennessee responded with a 50-yard kickoff return to get into IU territory. Johnson wiped that out with his 63-yard return.

Back-up Tennessee quarterback Brian Maurer led Tennessee to a field goal, but IU responded with a 49-yard Justus field goal for a 19-9 Hoosier lead entering the fourth quarter.

A third Justus field goal made it 22-9 with 10:27 remaining. Indiana wouldn't score again.
